1 MR. WARD: Today is December the 4th,  
2 2014. It is 10 a.m. and today is the second Public  
3 Hearing of the Authority's proposed 2015 Budget and  
4 proposed changes to the Rules, Rates and Regulations  
5 for the Authority for 2015. Appearing today is my  
6 Administrative Assistant, Ms. Stella Johnson, and  
7 there are no members for the public at this time.

8 I'm going to read into the record the  
9 Press Release of the hearings, which was published in  
10 the Atlantic City Press.

11 "The November 25, 2014 and December 4,  
12 2014 hearings will be held at the Atlantic City  
13 Municipal Utilities Authority, located at 401 North  
14 Virginia Avenue."

15 Also appearing, and I'll take a second  
16 to also announce that the Deputy Director of the  
17 Authority, Ms. Linda Bazemore, is also present.

18 "Both hearings will begin at 10 a.m.  
19 The budget is scheduled for adoption at the regularly  
20 scheduled Board Meeting on December 17, 2014.

21 "The MUA will also accept written  
22 comments. Comments received before the hearings will  
23 be read into the hearing record. Written comments  
24 not read at the hearings will be presented at the  
25 Board Meeting. The Board Meeting is open to the

1 public."

2 For most customers other than  
3 residential, there will be a rate increase between  
4 6.0 percent and 7.5 percent for water service in  
5 2015. Residential flat charges will increase by \$10  
6 per quarter and excess charges will increase by  
7 approximately \$2 per quarter for most customers with  
8 usage more than the allowance. The residential rate  
9 increase will be applicable on a per unit basis.

10 Over the last several years, the  
11 Atlantic City Municipal Utilities Authority has seen  
12 its expenses rise, however, its water sales since  
13 2006, has shown a steady and continual decline. The  
14 MUA attributes the decline to two primary factors.  
15 First is the removal of hotels and housing in  
16 Atlantic City through demolition. The Authority has  
17 forecasted in the 2015 budget a much more severe  
18 decline in sales. This is as a result of the closure  
19 of four casinos (Atlantic Club, Showboat, Revel and  
20 Trump Plaza) since the beginning of the year, with  
21 Trump Taj Mahal Hotel and Casino scheduled for  
22 closure in December of 2014. The next significant  
23 factor in the MUA's revenue decline is water  
24 conserving devices. Water conservation is always  
25 promoted in order to minimize the wasteful use of

1 resources. Since 1992, the MUA has seen an average  
2 gallons per capita per day in Atlantic City for  
3 residential customers drop from 97 to 73, almost a 25  
4 percent reduction. However, despite increased  
5 demand, the Authority does expect to meet its revenue  
6 projection for 2014.

7 The 2015 Proposed Budget is a fully  
8 funded budget providing for continuation of all of  
9 the Authority's major programs. The proposed  
10 appropriations for 2015 are anticipated to be  
11 approximately \$368,800 less than the budgeted  
12 appropriations for 2014. The decline is due  
13 primarily to a 26 percent or \$644,560 decline in 2015  
14 Debt Service Principal payments, Debt Service and  
15 Principal payments. In addition, the 2015 interest  
16 payments will be lower than 2014 by \$47,900.  
17 Somewhat offsetting the decline are higher  
18 anticipated electricity costs of approximately  
19 \$80,000.

20 "The MUA's proposed increase will be  
21 applied as a two percent increase in the flat charge  
22 for all customers except for the residential  
23 customers, who will experience a \$10 increase (per  
24 unit) for flat charges quarterly. In addition, all  
25 customers that experience higher usage than their

1 allowance will face an eight percent increase in  
2 excess charges.

3 "The average residential single-family  
4 property in Atlantic City currently pays \$213.92 per  
5 year for water. The MUA is projecting that, with  
6 this rate increase, the average consumer will pay  
7 \$261.45 per year. This is a \$47.53 per year increase  
8 per household.

9 "The connection fee rate will increase.

10 "State Law sets a formula mandating the  
11 specific calculation of Connection Fees. State Law  
12 further requires that Connection Fees be recalculated  
13 at the end of every calendar year, and that all Debt  
14 Service and Capital Expenditures be included in the  
15 new calculations.

16 "The net result is a proposed  
17 Connection Fee in 2015 of \$12.8637 per gallon of  
18 average daily flow. This applies to new  
19 construction."

20 The MUA is also making changes to  
21 Rules, Rates and Regulations. The full text of the  
22 changes is available by contacting the MUA's offices.  
23 It is also available on the MUA's website, which is  
24 [www.acmua.org](http://www.acmua.org).

25 And again, at this time there are no

14 to the Rules Rates Regulations and the Budget for

18 We will accept any written comments and  
19 certain written comments will be read at the Board  
20 Meeting, which is open to the public, and it will be  
21 held on December the 17th of this month. And that
