1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Good morning,
2 everybody. This is Gary Hill speaking for the court
3 reporter

4 Opening statement. Adequate notice of
5 this meeting has been provided as required by law by
6 mailing to The Press a list of the regularly
7 scheduled meetings, April 21st, 2022, at 401 North
8 Virginia Avenue conference room, Atlantic City, New
9 Jersey. A copy of said notice was sent to the City
10 Clerk to be posted. All of the aforesaid complies
11 with Chapter 231 of the Laws of 1975 known as the
12 Open Public Meetings Law.

13 And we will go now for a roll call,
14 Ms. Johnson.

15 MS. JOHNSON: Yes.

16 Mr. Hill?

17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Present.

18 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

19 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

20 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Banfield is absent.

21 Ms. Nynell?

22 MS. LANGFORD: Here.

23 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Eccles is absent.

24 Ms. Davies?

25 MS. DAVIES: Here.

1 MS. JOHNSON: And Mr. Kausar?

2 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

4 I want to welcome, again, or two
5 alternates, they'll be voting today since we have two
6 of our board members not with us.

7 We're going start with our flag salute
8 I going to ask our Vice Chair Mr. Dedar, if you could
9 lead us please?

10 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

11 (Whereupon, all rise for a recitation
12 of the Pledge of Allegiance as led by Vice
13 Chairman Dedar.)

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

15 We also open up all of our meetings
16 with (Audio Distortion) of the public. And I'm going
17 to see there's no public in the board's room at this
18 time.

19 I am going to ask our secretary,
20 Ms. Johnson, if we have any public participation via
21 Zoom or e-mail.

22 MS. JOHNSON: None called or are
23 present.

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

25 As customary we're going to move to the

1 approval of minutes, the open session which was our
2 last board meeting on March 15th. Everybody should
3 have received those ahead of time to review.

4 Are there any changes or additions or
5 questions?

6 (No response.)

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. So we're going
8 to approve them so I'm going to need a motion for
9 approval.

10 MS. DAVIES: I'll make the motion.

11 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Motion.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

13 Ms. Davies made a motion

14 Can I have a second?

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Did we get a second?

16 Mr. Dedar, you second it?

17 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: No, I motion it.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, you motioned it.

19 And Ms. Davies will second it.

20 Very good. So we can just do a roll
21 call for that.

22 MS. JOHNSON: Yes.

23 Mr. Dedar?

24 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

25 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Banfield?

1 (No response.)

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: No, he's absent.

3 MS. JOHNSON: I'm sorry.

4 Absent.

5 Mr. Hill?

6 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

7 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Nynell?

8 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

9 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Eccles is absent.
10 Ms. Davies?

11 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

12 MS. JOHNSON: And Mr. Kausar?

13 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Very good.

15 Thank you.

16 All of you took some time and I thank
17 you for reading and reviewing the closed session
18 minutes.

19 We have two sets, February 16th and
20 March 15th. I just finished that myself a few
21 minutes ago reviewing and signing off on that.
22 Closed session cannot -- those minutes do not go out
23 to the public, obviously, and we keep them in-house.

24 Correct, Mr. Ward?

25 MR. WARD: Yes.

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: So we all reviewed
2 them. The people that were a part of the
3 February 16th meeting -- meeting, I'm sorry,
4 reviewed, so I am know Mr. Eccles and I believe Mr.
5 Kausar did not review them because they weren't part
6 of that.

7 So it looks like everybody,
8 Ms. Johnson, has reviewed the closed session for the
9 16th of February and March 15th.

10 Could you confirm that?

11 MS. JOHNSON: Yes, confirmed.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: So we do have all the
13 closed -- the two months of closed sessions, people
14 who needed to review and sign off on that has
15 proceeded.

16 So I am going to look for a motion to
17 move to approve the closed session minutes.

18 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Motion.

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

20 MS. DAVIES: Second.

21 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: You're welcome.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: And a second by
23 Ms. Davies, I'm just saying that for the Court
24 Reporter.

25 And we'll take a roll call vote.

1 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

2 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

3 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

5 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

6 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

7 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

8 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

9 MS. JOHNSON: And, Mr. Kausar?

10 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

11 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

12 The only thing I have as Chairman is
13 we're going to be discussing a number of very
14 important, kind of, updates, in closed session which
15 we'll do. And one of the things I know is very
16 important to a lot of us here as we include the board
17 members that are with us via Zoom is our negotiations
18 with our workers, how the contracts are going and
19 also the incentive program that we talked about last
20 board meeting and getting into more detail with our
21 labor counsel Mr. Reilly who I believe is on the
22 line, when we get into closed session. Okay?

23 Mr. Ward, we, of course, welcomed last
24 month as our now solicitor. He's up next. I do know
25 I had a conversation, just for everybody else's

1 information, about how he feels working as solicitor
2 now here, what he's been doing. He's been very busy.
3 He, of course, has been involved in some committee
4 meetings. He's been reviewing a lot of
5 documentation. He's been getting his feet wet so to
6 speak, even though he -- he's had some experience, of
7 course, here as a executive director in the past.

8 So I'm going to ask Mr. Ward if he has
9 any comments he'd like to make to the full board at
10 this point?

11 MR. WARD: Well, good morning and
12 welcome to everyone.

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: Speak up.

14 MR. WARD: I'm not speaking loud
15 enough.

16 Welcome to everyone and good morning.
17 We're off to a start. I have a number of items that
18 I'll be discussing with the board in closed session.

19 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm sorry.

20 Mr. Ward, would you please speak up,
21 it's hard to hear you.

22 MR. WARD: Okay. I'm sorry.

23 I pulled my mask down, hopefully, you
24 know, you can hear better, but I will be discussing a
25 matter in closed session that was assigned to me by

1 Mr. Armstrong. There are number of other programs
2 that we concluded were proper for the Authority
3 during the first month of my solicitorship so we will
4 be discussing them in closed session.

5 Thank you.

6 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Mr. Ward.

7 I do have one question, I'm not sure if
8 you can answer, Mr. Ward, or, Mr. Armstrong, I know
9 Mr. Bor, our former solicitor, had -- we moved
10 forward on the agreement with the DEP I guess it was,
11 the money -- the settlement --

12 MR. WARD: The UST violation.

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: The violation.

14 MR. WARD: We can give you an update.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Can you give us an
16 update on that --

17 MR. WARD: Sure.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- and are we paid?
19 Are we done with that settlement?

20 MR. WARD: We paid.

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: We paid? That's all I
22 want to know.

23 MR. WARD: We paid.

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. So we're done
25 with that issue?

1 MR. WARD: Yes.

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Perfect.

3 Thank you. That was just my only
4 question.

5 Okay. We're going to move on to
6 committee reports which is number eight in our
7 general agenda.

8 Engineering committee, we did not meet
9 this last month, we will be meeting in May.

10 Mr. Eccles is part of that new
11 committee as well as Mr. Banfield, if Mr. Eccles
12 cannot attend. So we'll move -- we'll go along -- I
13 think it's May 9th, something like that, is our
14 engineering committee.

15 I know we had a personnel committee,
16 Mr. Dedar is Chairman, held that last couple of weeks
17 ago.

18 Mr. Dedar, would you like to report?
19 There's not a whole lot there, but maybe you can give
20 us a quick recap of your personal committee and how
21 that went please?

22 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes. Thank you,
23 Mr. Chairman.

24 We don't have -- we have just first
25 meeting and, of course, this was my first meeting and

1 I had a very good experienced guy with this meeting
2 and already the Executive Director, you guys already
3 know, he is doing a fabulous job. And he's guiding
4 us.

5 We had something, a few things to
6 discussion. And first of all, I'd like to thank
7 everyone and from my side as a Muslim community is
8 happy Ramadan, you know, this is the first in time
9 and me and Mr. -- we have another board member, Sayed
10 Kausar. This is very hard, this time is meeting,
11 because our fasting time. And we do like six in the
12 morning, we sleep, and because we attend the meeting
13 and I'd like to thank you my all board members and
14 whatever the team, I have the Personnel Committee.
15 We have been discussing a little bit, Mr. Chairman,
16 Mike, he told us we have to do the update to agenda
17 because it's policies as -- some policies are very
18 old, so he tried to do organize everything. And he's
19 organize a policy that he was looking for some other
20 issue so -- but, like I said this was the very first
21 meeting and I don't have that much to explain.

22 Hopefully the next meeting we have to
23 have a more agenda and more items to discuss with you
24 and let you know.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

1 Mr. Armstrong, do you any follow up on
2 that since you refer to that?

3 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yes.

4 Mike Armstrong speaking.

5 The -- because it was the first meeting
6 --

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: -- we
9 just tried to do what is more or less transitional
10 meeting. We provided all the new members with all
11 the materials that were provided to the prior board
12 members, all the job descriptions the organizational
13 chart, as well as the sick leave policy that we were
14 working on and a copy of the draft employment manual.

15 So that's the direction that we're
16 going to be moving in and looking at those items.

17 And we had some discussions about
18 reopening the MUA offices to the public, which is
19 something that I wanted to have a conversation about
20 today, probably now is a good time to have it.

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Sure.

22 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: One of
23 the suggestions that came up is allowing the public
24 to come in, but by appointment only.

25 Now initially when we had the

1 discussion about opening up to the public again it
2 was related to what was going on in -- with Omicron
3 at the time. Cases had dropped significantly. But
4 now they're on the rise with this new BA2 variant, so
5 we, kind of, put the brakes on it and said maybe we
6 need to re-think how we reopen.

7 Most other businesses are opening up to
8 public again. As you can see across the country mask
9 mandates are being dropped everywhere.

10 So, you know, we probably need to come
11 up with a strategy for reopening, that takes into
12 consideration what's happening right now with the BA2
13 variant.

14 One of the suggestions that we have,
15 like I said, is that the public be allowed to come
16 into the facility but by appointment or by Zoom. You
17 know where there would be a one-on-one Zoom
18 conference, if they prefer not to have direct
19 contact, but they need more than telephone contact.

20 And maybe we revisit the policy again
21 each month and adopt a policy depending upon how the
22 pandemic is moving forward.

23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Discussion from other
24 board members on that?

25 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes, sir.

2 Mr. Dedar?

3 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, Mr.

4 Chairman, I have to ask a question for Mr. Mike,
5 because last couple of days I had a very good
6 pressure from the public from the city residents of
7 Atlantic City, they are -- keep asking because they
8 don't know what kinds of power I have, but they say:
9 Hey, you are Vice Chairman, you can you it. I said:
10 Listen, I can't do nothing this is the board, this is
11 the -- we have something to policy.

12 So they're asking: Everybody is open.
13 All official state, county, city, all, what's
14 happened significant in the MUA because people there
15 -- I know they're used to, but let say there is one
16 box for drop the mail and they did not mention
17 actually where is it. So sometime they put it on the
18 top and floor, if you check the box -- I mean I did
19 not check it, they write it down or mention why it
20 should be dropped. So I think so this kinds of hard
21 time for them. And is it considered to Mike and, you
22 know, poll the board and I don't know the state is
23 related to that is open or closing.

24 So I like to request is anyway we can
25 do the open because it's -- like I say, we have to

1 follow up with this because people are keep asking
2 for that, why it's not open.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: So you're in support of
4 opening normal hours?

5 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, of course,
6 because all people, if you -- because last time I
7 say, remember, a few meetings I asked why it's not
8 opening and the problem is like if some employees
9 say: Oh, we are here. So I don't know, people don't
10 be -- it's like I have some little background as an
11 IT because the IT is -- what's happening right now,
12 the people love to do their work from the home. This
13 output it comes much, much bigger than before because
14 sometimes go to the office, chill out, they don't do.
15 Now they're staying home, they're doing everything
16 and they're doing their homework or whatever it's
17 office work is -- is significant comes and follow up
18 is good.

19 But, again, is the MUA, if somebody's
20 scared to come in the office, so how they come to
21 going to work first?

22 The second, they're actually kind of
23 secure because they're inside. They're not publicly
24 like those in touch with the money. So they're
25 paying their bill or checking because of course every

1 -- all they're still in the room. So people can see
2 from outside and even they say because of the masks
3 so those -- those things, you know, I don't know as a
4 board member I request to the board and, of course,
5 our executive director, he can think about it because
6 everybody is open, that people are right now in the
7 public.

8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: I just
9 want to be clear, we don't have anybody working at
10 home.

11 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: No, no, no, yeah.
12 I know.

13 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: You're talking about
15 the community in, itself, right?

16 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Right. Right.

17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Langford, do you
18 have any opinion on this because it's a --

19 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- right down the
21 middle.

22 MS. LANGFORD: Yeah, I do, only because
23 of the -- only because of the position that as a city
24 worker and we are open for business, but it's not
25 open. It's not the way that it was.

1 And so in opening we -- I don't think
2 we ever can go back totally to what we used to be.
3 We just can't. That's reality. So open, yes, but it
4 has to be revised. It has to be different. It has
5 to be protection for our employees. It has to be
6 protection for our customers.

7 So we can't just open as usual, that
8 will not work. And that is why we're seeing this
9 uptick in risk because people are thinking we can do
10 what we used to do and we can't.

11 So you know not being opposed to it
12 being closed, but opening with caution, if that makes
13 sense.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: It makes total sense.

15 Thank you.

16 Ms. Davies?

17 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

18 Do we have SOPs? Because I know in my
19 job we had to send SOPs to the state. We had to file
20 our guidelines.

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: I don't know that.

22 Do you know that?

23 MR. WARD: I don't know.

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: I don't think so.

25 Not that I'm aware.

1 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: When
2 you said -- excuse me, Claude Smith speaking.

3 When you said SOPs, you're talking
4 about SOPs in regards to how we need to open to the
5 public or --

6 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

7 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: -- how
8 we operate in terms of --

9 MS. DAVIES: I was talking in regards
10 to COVID and how we -- how the building operates
11 because we had to do -- we had to submit
12 documentation to the state, I mean this was school,
13 so it's probably different.

14 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Yes.
15 Yes.

16 MS. DAVIES: But -- but I'm thinking if
17 you have people coming in and you had the staff, it
18 would be the staff first because if your staff gets
19 sick and then comes in contact with 10 or 15 people
20 that may come in, now you just opened the trace
21 contacts and all that. So you have like -- so could
22 we could get like a -- like a little iPad kiosk
23 where, like, people will pay by their debit card,
24 it's not -- they're not in contact with the physical
25 person that would help, you know, like a soft opening

1 where you start there, until we know the numbers are
2 where they're at. So it's good for the person who is
3 going to be taking in the payments.

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right, right.

5 ASSISTANT DIRECTOR SMITH: This is
6 Claude Smith again speaking, I guess, just a general
7 exposure to the public period, in regards to opening
8 our doors for people to come in at -- at random for
9 at a particular time that they would like to.

10 Of course, as Ms. Langford just
11 mentioned we do have to do certain things with
12 caution.

13 In regards to an SOP, we don't have a
14 set of operating procedures with regards to opening
15 to the public for -- for COVID.

16 But we do have our -- our rules and
17 regulations internally in regards to us being closed
18 and how we actually operate internally with -- yes,
19 with protocols internally.

20 But in regards to opening up, of
21 course, I -- like we said we'll just have to have
22 that -- that discussion.

23 People are encouraged and have been
24 encouraged to pay on line or to do a payment to the
25 drop box and, you know, again so far that has been

1 working for -- I guess for -- for Mr. Mohammed, the
2 people that are probably approaching him probably are
3 not quite fully understanding how to utilize the drop
4 box. And they're probably having an issue in terms
5 of where they put their -- the envelope where they
6 come to put their money or put their payment in the
7 drop box.

8 I mean it might just be a few -- few
9 individuals that's actually requesting that or have
10 an issue with that.

11 But aside from that, it has been
12 working pretty well for us.

13 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: But I
14 understand the -- why it comes up and why -- this is
15 Mike Armstrong speaking -- because when you go to
16 public building after public building and they're not
17 requiring it then you get to the MUA and the door is
18 locked --

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

20 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: -- it's
21 going to constantly be an issue.

22 I do think that to a certain extent we
23 have to start to provide some news, here's why
24 because even the employees here when they leave they
25 go into those same buildings, you know, they go into

1 the supermarket. They have contact with people.
2 They're having contact.

3 So they're exposing themselves to way
4 they don't want other people, to a certain extent, to
5 expose them by coming into our building.

6 So it's sort of, in a way, it's kind of
7 a contradiction, you know, to enter other buildings
8 and have contact because you want access. There are
9 certain people who are going to want to be -- need
10 greater assistance in some ways.

11 I think the idea of having access can
12 come in the form of an appointment, that way you
13 meter your number of people that come in and you're
14 not having groups of people come in. That's where
15 the exposure starts to happen --

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

17 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: -- if
18 three or four people start to flood the lobby at the
19 same time, but when you do it by appointment you give
20 access. And access is what -- what is key because I
21 understand that although a lot of agencies are open,
22 a lot of them are open only by appointment. State
23 agencies like DMV and other agencies that normally
24 would allow walk-ins. They don't want crowds to
25 gather.

1 So I think that maybe should be our
2 objective to avoiding crowds gathering it's --
3 because we have small spaces --

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

5 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: --
6 the only way to limit that, to me, is to be able to
7 meter it by appointment only.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

9 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: You
10 know, because if we do it otherwise and we say:
11 Okay, we'll just let -- allow walk-ins and we have --
12 you would have to wait outside until somebody walks
13 outside. And that, to me, just doesn't look
14 appropriate. So I would suggest, you know, that we
15 allow people who want to come in say that -- have a
16 notice on the door and on our website that it be by
17 appointment or Zoom.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

19 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH:
20 Because people have grown accustomed to using Zoom.
21 It's convenient.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Mr. Kausar, do you have
23 any point opinion?

24 MR. KAUSAR: Yeah. It's okay. I agree
25 with Dedar, whatever he said to you.

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

2 MR. KAUSAR: So you can -- you can
3 think about it.

4 Thank you.

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: It's kind of like a
6 football game, we're getting down to the goal post so
7 we move from the one zone into the middle of the
8 field so we get to the order point. I agree with
9 Ms. Langford I don't think it's ever going to be
10 quite the same.

11 Two questions, if we go by appointment:
12 One, who's going to take the appointments; and, two,
13 I'm assuming we can easily put that on our website,
14 appointments now available for in-person meetings,
15 correct?

16 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: We
17 can.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: And who would be taking
19 the appointments in that event? If they have a
20 question with their bills, you know --

21 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Yes.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- back when we had an
23 individual that they're just coming in to make a
24 payment, of course that's another issue, so we can
25 work that out internally?

1 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH:

2 Correct.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

4 We really -- we just -- this isn't a
5 resolution or anything. It's just a policy we're
6 trying to establish.

7 So I'm sensing that most people want to
8 do, we're going to try to move forward a little bit,
9 we'll go by appointments by Zoom, by phone, if
10 there's a phone conversation they need to be had and
11 we'll revisit this then in another month or so in our
12 next meeting.

13 Is that acceptable at this point,
14 today, April 21st?

15 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: We can't
16 hear him, he's talking. Mr. Dedar.

17 CHAIRMAN HILL: He's muted.

18 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: You're
19 muted, Mr. Dedar.

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Is that okay for a
21 month or so?

22 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG:

23 Mr. Dedar, you're muted.

24 Okay. You're unmuted.

25 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, yes.

1 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: We
2 didn't hear anything you said.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yeah, I -- I --
4 listen, I'm sorry, I was on another phone
5 conversation.

6 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Oh,
7 okay.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, okay.
9 So we're all good? All right. We'll
10 move on.

11 Thank you.
12 We're going to start to add as soon as
13 you can.

14 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Yes.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right guys?

16 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Yes.

17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Executive
18 Director, you started in your report.

19 Anything else you'd like to add? I
20 know you have some issues at closed session.

21 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Yes. I
22 do have one thing for today while -- now that you're
23 in this -- we in -- Mike Armstrong speaking -- now
24 we're on this issue of a problem with communicating
25 via Zoom and understanding one another. I sent,

1 about two months ago, a -- a product, a camera that
2 sits in the middle of the table, do you remember
3 that?

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

5 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: And what
6 it will do is, it will -- it will automatically focus
7 on your face as you're speaking so we don't have
8 these issues with Zoom in the future. And it works
9 directly with Zoom and it's designed for Zoom, but as
10 opposed to it being where you see the whole room, it
11 sits in the middle of the table and focuses on the
12 individual's face because it has cameras in the dome
13 --

14 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: The 360.

15 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Yes, the
16 360-degree camera.

17 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

18 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: It's
19 approximately 900-and-some-odd dollars.

20 I sent the brochure around. It's okay
21 with you, if you think it's something we should
22 utilize, I'll order it.

23 And I do want to let you know that we
24 did -- we didn't have a major credit card for that
25 anyway, we do now. So we're able to make that

1 purchase --

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

3 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: -- you
4 know, the PCAR program was successful and that -- but
5 you're okay with that, I will place that order.

6 CHAIRMAN HILL: We all good?

7 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, good idea,
8 Mike. Yeah.

9 CHAIRMAN HILL: We're good, Michael.
10 Thank you.

11 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: I see the e-mail
12 before, I mean he sent an e-mail for everybody.

13 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Yes.
14 Yes.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Anything else --

16 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: That's why I
17 remember the 360 degrees, you know.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: We'll be able to get a
19 bird's-eye view of all of us. We can see each other
20 nice and close and personal.

21 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: That's correct.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Our Deputy
23 Executive Director Mr. Smith, I know we didn't have
24 any engineering issues even though we had issues to
25 deal with in the city, do you want to make a report

1 on some of your stuff now or do you want to wait
2 until we get to it, your services?

3 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Yes,
4 we'll wait.

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: We'll wait. Okay.
6 Very good.

7 Then we're -- then, Anita, you're up
8 here, accounting and finance. We're at 9(a) -- I'm
9 sorry 9(c)1, 2, 3, 4, all of this is standard. Every
10 month we look at this. I believe we are now allowed
11 to do shut-offs, correct? April 15th or something?

12 MS. THAPA: Yes. Good morning, all.
13 Yes, we are allowed. We also sent to all our
14 customers who have a bill -- a balance of 250 to --
15 you know, to give them more -- a year payment plan.

16 However we have not received any
17 feedback from customer. We only received about --
18 out of, like, maybe 2,000 we sent, not even 100 we
19 received. So hopefully customers are aware of their
20 balance.

21 And we also submitted to the state for
22 the water assistance program on that one, so that's
23 still working. We are still in the process of it.
24 So far it hasn't -- nobody has applied yet or we
25 haven't had -- have any information on that, but

1 shut-off will be likely to start, depending on our
2 manpower as well because whoever does our shut-off is
3 not a -- I mean he already retired there. So, like I
4 said, depending on the manpower and maybe not in May.
5 We're probably going to send notices to the customer
6 in May, but in June we should be starting our
7 shut-off.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: A question, Anita, the
9 balance adjustment --

10 MS. THAPA: Yes.

11 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- have you amended
12 them?

13 MS. THAPA: Balance adjustments are
14 just for the information only, usually it's about
15 coupling leaks or any adjustment to the accounts, you
16 know, on the -- that's just a general information as
17 well.

18 We have --

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: And we do that all the
20 time?

21 MS. THAPA: I'm sorry.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: We do that all the
23 time, correct?

24 MS. THAPA: Yes. Yes.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes, okay. Just so

1 other people know that. It's not like --

2 MS. THAPA: Yes.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- we haven't --

4 MS. THAPA: If you see any -- you know,
5 if you have any questions in why the big adjustment
6 is there, you know, just feel free to reach out to me
7 and I will be able to explain to that.

8 But that's just the one page because if
9 we provide you all the supporting documents --

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

11 MS. THAPA: -- it's going to be whole
12 pages so -- I mean a lot of pages. So we didn't want
13 to waste the time so it's just the summary of it, one
14 page per account so.

15 This month is probably not -- not a
16 lot, but usually it's either for the coupling leak or
17 when we provide the abatement to the customers or
18 sometimes, you know, check roots, there's an error
19 adjustment. So, basically it's that, is the balance
20 adjustments.

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

22 MR. WARD: Can I -- on the heels of the
23 lower income housing water assistance program this is
24 federal money that was delivered to the state to
25 provide this program for individuals who got behind.

1 It seems as though the state has not
2 followed up in terms of setting up the protocols for
3 people, so I'm going to following up with the state.
4 I wrote to them on March 23rd to secure our reporting
5 time. It's different from their reporting time and
6 they agreed --

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

8 MR. WARD: -- so...

9 MS. THAPA: I heard -- I only heard one
10 customer called us and said she applied to the -- to
11 the website, but we haven't heard anything, you know,
12 how to proceed, you know, like Mr. Ward said.

13 So if you could help us on that.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: So we have one
15 customer, Anita, that's -- that requires - inquired,
16 correct?

17 MS. THAPA: Well, she says she -- she
18 applied to the state's website.

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh.

20 MS. THAPA: There's a website where you
21 could, you know, any customer, you know, who's low
22 income, they can apply it. So we have only one
23 customer who said she -- she was going to or I'm not
24 sure if she already applied for it.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: All right.

1 MR. WARD: We might want to put that
2 link on our website --

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Good idea.

4 MR. WARD: -- for our customers.

5 MS. THAPA: It's already -- it is
6 already on our website.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: It is?

8 MS. THAPA: Yes.

9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Very good.
10 We have -- that's a new program. Now I
11 believe, Mr. Ward, we just need to -- there's now a
12 resolution which you approve for finance reports?

13 MR. WARD: Yes.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah.

15 So we're going to move to approve the
16 finance reports that Anita just reported on. She
17 went over a nice description.

18 She's a little hard to hear for all of
19 us, not just her, everybody, I apologize for that.
20 It's difficult because of the Zoom and the distance.
21 So we'll go from there.

22 If nobody has any other questions?

23 (No response.)

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. We don't have a
25 motion, but all in favor of approving the finance

1 report say, "Aye," Board Members.

2 MS. THAPA: I'm sorry just in the
3 future -- I mean in the past we did not approve it.

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Do we need to do each
5 one?

6 MS. THAPA: No, it's nothing to
7 approve, you know, it's just for the information
8 only.

9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

10 MS. THAPA: So we don't have to approve
11 it.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: All right. Fine. It's
13 more information. That's fine. No problem.

14 Now, going into old business we have
15 things to approve or not approve.

16 So we're going to move into No. 10
17 accepting bids.

18 Last month we went out for these bids,
19 some of this is standard procedure that we always do
20 and we're looking at the first one which is 10a, one,
21 it's a chloride water treatment chemical, any --
22 we're going to have Ms. Johnson please read that
23 resolution first so we're all clear on what we're
24 voting on.

25 MS. JOHNSON: Okay. Polyaluminum

1 Chloride.

2 "BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of
3 Directors of the Atlantic City Municipal
4 Utilities Authority that the bid of USALCO,
5 LLC, a corporation of the State of Maryland,
6 to FURNISHING AND DELIVERING POLYALUMINUM
7 CHLORIDE, to the Pumping Station of the
8 ATLANTIC CITY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY
9 located at 1151 North Main Street,
10 Pleasantville, New Jersey, which bid was
11 received and publicly opened and read at the
12 meeting of the Purchasing Board of the
13 ATLANTIC CITY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY,
14 held on April 12, 2022, be and the same bid is
15 hereby ACCEPTED, the said USALCO, LLC, being
16 the lowest responsible bidder for the said
17 undertaking."

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Ms. Johnson.
19 Discussion?

20 Looking for a resolution -- I mean -- a
21 motion to approve.

22 Mr. Smith has a discussion as one thing
23 before we go.

24 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Just
25 being informative of the --

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Mr. Smith?

2 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: -- so
3 you're aware in regards to the scenarios with the
4 particular chemicals that we utilize for treatment,
5 water treatment, this particular chemical the
6 Polyaluminum Chloride, as you can see we only have
7 one -- one response --

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

9 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: I
10 just want to make it clear and be open with the board
11 that this particular chemical went up 40 percent --

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Phew.

13 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: --
14 40 percent from last year.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Wow.

16 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: We
17 were -- we were sent a letter prior to this asking
18 for -- asking to extent the price of this particular
19 chemical based on the previous resolution that we had
20 and, of course, it forced us to actually go out for a
21 bid proposal for this chemical.

22 Like I said, I just want to make
23 everyone be aware that this particular chemical and
24 probably other chemicals that we actually are
25 utilizing will be increasing. This one went up at

1 least 40 percent.

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Just like the food
3 market, everything is more now.

4 Okay. So now, thank you for that
5 information, we're looking to motion to accept.

6 MS. DAVIES: I make a motion.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Davies.

8 A second?

9 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

11 Roll call?

12 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

13 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

14 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

16 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

17 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

18 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

19 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

20 MS. JOHNSON: And Mr. Kausar?

21 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Thank you.

23 Moving on to 10b -- 10-2, it's fire
24 hydrants repairs. This is something we constantly
25 keep having to do.

1 Correct, Mr. Smith?

2 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH:

3 That's correct.

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: So, Ms. Johnson, would
5 you read the resolution please?

6 MS. JOHNSON: "BE IT RESOLVED, by the
7 Board of Directors of the Atlantic City
8 Municipal Utilities Authority that bids were
9 received and publicly opened and read at a
10 meeting of the Purchasing Board held Tuesday,
11 April 12, 2022 for FURNISHING AND DELIVERING
12 FIRE HYDRANTS, STAINLESS STEEL REPAIR CLAMPS
13 AND CAST IRON FITTINGS, for use of the said
14 Water Department."

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

16 Discussion?

17 (No response.)

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Comments?

19 (No response.)

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Looking for a motion to
21 accept.

22 I'll move it.

23 MS. DAVIES: Second.

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Second by Ms. Davies.

25 Let's do a roll call.

1 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

2 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

3 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

5 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

6 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

7 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

8 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

9 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Kausar?

10 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

11 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

12 We're on to 11 on the general agenda.

13 Here we're going to be going out for bids for many of
14 the things that make our wonderful MUA work and
15 function.

16 So we're going to go solicit bids for
17 the first one janitorial services for the operations
18 facility and the treatment plant. I guess we need to
19 do them separately, right?

20 MR. WARD: Yes.

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: So let's do -- could
22 you read for 11-1 please.

23 This will be for operations.

24 MS. JOHNSON: "BE IT RESOLVED, by the
25 Board of Directors of the Atlantic City

1 Municipal Utilities Authority that the
2 Advertisement, Proposal Form and the
3 Specifications and Instructions to Bidders
4 this day submitted by the Deputy Executive
5 Director of Engineering for PROVIDING
6 JANITORIAL SERVICES AT THE AUTHORITY
7 ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATIONS FACILITY, 401
8 NORTH VIRGINIA AVENUE, ATLANTIC CITY, NEW
9 JERSEY, be and the said documents are hereby
10 APPROVED AND ADOPTED."

11 To be held on Tuesday, May 10, 2022, at
12 11 a.m.

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you very much.
14 Discussion or comments?

15 (No response.)

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: I have one question. I
17 know we've had some issues before with janitorial
18 services in the past, do you remember all of that?
19 We went out a couple of times.

20 Remember, Mr. Ward?

21 MR. WARD: Yes, I do.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: I think it's been much
23 better since we redid some things that we were
24 looking closer, we just got to keep our head on --
25 you know, our neck to make sure we know what we're

1 doing again because there were some real issues we
2 had. But I think we're better.

3 Correct, Mr. Smith?

4 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH:

5 That's rue. That's right, yes.

6 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Very good.

7 So I'm looking for a motion to go out
8 to bid.

9 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Motion.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. We're going to
11 do one, just the first one.

12 Okay. Motion?

13 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Motion.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Mr. Dedar.

15 MS. DAVIES: Second.

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Second Ms. Davies.

17 Roll call.

18 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

19 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

20 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

22 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

23 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

24 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

25 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

1 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Kausar?

2 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

4 No. 2 is exactly the same thing but
5 we're going to the water treatment plant.

6 Ms. Johnson, could you read the
7 resolution please?

8 MS. JOHNSON: "BE IT RESOLVED, by the

20 We're moving on to three, this is
21 something we need the carbon -- granular activated
22 carbon.

23 Mr. Smith, tell us a little bit why we
24 need that.

25 But let's do the resolution reading

1 first.

3 Board of Directors of the Atlantic City
4 Municipal Utilities Authority that the
5 Advertisement, Proposal Form, and the

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

16 Mr. Smith, could you just inform the
17 board why we need this?

18 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Yes,
19 of course.

20 This is one of the products that we're
21 using to help --

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

23 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: -- the
24 situation of PFOS (phonetic) and also with the
25 cleaning up our water as we go through a treatment

1 process.

2 Despite the fact that we last purchased
3 carbon over the last several months, not knowing when
4 the break-out process would actually occur for carbon
5 and exchange -- exchange or replenishing of our
6 carbon, we're putting out some -- we're going to put
7 out bids at this particular time period to make sure
8 that we are at least in line for receiving this
9 particular product --

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

11 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: -- if
12 and when needed.

13 So that's one of the reasons I asked to
14 put that on.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

16 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Just
17 to be proactive for it.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. I think it's
19 proactive --

20 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: It is
21 being proactive.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. And this is
23 exceedingly important for our PFOS issue as we
24 stated.

25 So any other discussion?

1 (No response.)

17 A second?

18 MS. DAVIES: Second.

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Davies.

20 Roll call.

21 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

22 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

23 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

25 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

9 replace, because it's what we do.

14 Municipal Utilities Authority that the
15 Advertisement, Proposal Form and the

19 DELIVERING METER PARTS AND EQUIPMENT be and
20 the said documents are hereby APPROVED and
21 ADOPTED..." at a Purchasing Board meeting to
22 be later determined.

23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you so much.

24 And comments or discussion?

25 (No response.)

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: I am sure this price
2 will go up.

3 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Well,
4 you're absolutely correct everything is going to be
5 going up no matter what we're purchasing now.

6 This is not for the meters this is just
7 for meter parts to put on to -- to accessorize what
8 we're putting in the meters.

9 So this is different from actually
10 purchasing of the meters itself. This is for the
11 parts. These are just parts.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, okay.

13 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: We
14 purchased meters.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: This is parts, the
16 parts price won't go up? I doubt it.

17 So we will see.

18 Okay. Do we have any other discussion?

19 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes, sir, Mr. Dedar?

21 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, Mr.

22 Chairman, I see this one is meter parts and
23 equipments, I know the meter parts, what's the
24 equipments with the meter-related or any other
25 equipments?

1 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Meter
2 boxes -- Claude Smith speaking again -- meter boxes.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: It's meter --
4 meter-related, right?

5 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: It's
6 all meter -- yes, all meter-related, correct.

7 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Okay. Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Good. Thank you.

9 I'm looking for a motion.

10 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Motion.

11 MS. DAVIES: Second.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: And a second.

13 Thank you.

14 Roll call?

15 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

16 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

17 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

19 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

1 We're going onto B, emergency repairs.

2 MR. WARD: No, there's one more.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, there is?

4 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: There's one more.

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, wait a minute. Oh,
6 I'm sorry, yes. Here it is.

7 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: 11a(6).

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Water service lateral.
9 Okay.

10 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Water service,
11 yes.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Johnson, read the
13 resolution please.

14 MS. JOHNSON: "BE IT RESOLVED, by the
15 Board of Directors of the Atlantic City
16 Municipal Utilities Authority that the
17 Advertisement, Proposal Form and the
18 Specifications and Instructions to the Bidders
19 this day submitted by the Deputy Executive
20 Director of Engineering for FURNISH, DELIVER
21 AND INSTALL WATER SERVICE LATERALS be and the
22 said documents are hereby APPROVED and
23 ADOPTED..." at a Purchasing Board meeting on
24 a date later to be announced.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

1 Discussion?

2 (No response.)

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Comments?

4 (No response.)

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. We'll look for a
6 motion please.

7 MS. DAVIES: I'll make a motion.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Ms. Davies.

9 A second?

10 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Second.

11 CHAIRMAN HILL: Second. Thank you.

12 Roll call.

13 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

14 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

15 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

17 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

18 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

25 emergency repairs, unfortunately these things happen.

1 We need to take care of it. Resolution 11b discusses
2 that in quite detail.

3 So we're going read the resolution
4 please?

5 MS. JOHNSON: "WHEREAS, the Atlantic
6 City Municipal Utilities Authority owns and
7 operates its own Water Department; and.

8 "WHEREAS, a water main break occurred
9 on Route 87/Huron Avenue on January 26th,
10 2022; and

11 "WHEREAS, the 12-inch water main
12 required a complete shutdown in order to
13 prevent flooding of the highway; and

14 "WHEREAS, the Authority made a decision
15 to abandon the 12-inch water main in place,
16 due to the fact that the main does not service
17 or impact any residents or facilities in the
18 area and to remove two existing fire hydrants
19 connected to said water main, by cutting the
20 water main and installing two 12-inch
21 Mechanical Joint Cap and Mega Lugs..."

22 "...and WHEREAS, the Atlantic City
23 Municipal Utilities Authority in discharging
24 its responsibility to maintain the Authority
25 Water Service, hired SOUTH STATE, INC.," to

1 perform said emergency repairs in the amount
2 of \$30,150.00.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you very much.
4 It's a long resolution.

5 I do want to -- comments and
6 discussion, I do want to compliment our staff and, of
7 course, the company for working on this so
8 efficiently and I'm going to see if Mr. Smith to tell
9 us that we had no follow-up problem, did we?

10 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: I
11 remember in January this -- this was -- this was the
12 break that occurred back then which we got an
13 extension from DEP, that particular line was a line
14 that was compromised a couple of times prior.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

16 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Of
17 course, based on the fact that we have this one
18 additional break at that location, and doing some
19 additional research and talking to the assistant
20 manager at the time, we realized that this particular
21 line did not really service much of anything. So the
22 -- the decision to actually cut and cap that
23 particular main at a certain location, which did
24 occur, it's already been done.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

1 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Just
2 want to inform the board and everyone as well to
3 that.

4 In addition to this particular
5 emergency repair that was actually done, South State
6 did some work out there prior because of the fact
7 that we did have a sinkhole that occurred at the
8 location where the break was. And --

9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Is that part of this
10 prive?

11 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: No.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: I knew that was the
13 answer.

14 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: So
15 this is for just the result of some work that they
16 did in regards for repairing that sinkhole that
17 occurred after the break out there.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

19 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: But
20 this is -- this is to assist us to not having any
21 further issues --

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

23 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: -- at
24 that location.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right, right. Any

1 other questions?

2 (No response.)

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Comment?

4 Okay. So it's \$30,150.00, this is an
5 emergency order.

6 I'm looking for a motion.

7 MS. DAVIES: I make a motion.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Davies.

9 A second?

10 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Second.

11 CHAIRMAN HILL: Roll call.

12 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

13 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

14 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

16 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Nynell?

17 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

18 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

19 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

20 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Kausar?

21 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Another emergency
23 repair that had to be done this is Garrison
24 Enterprises. Garrison's been around, we've used them
25 quite a lot. Likely the monies not quite as big,

1 but we're going to look at now 11b(2) resolution.

2 Can we read the resolution please?

3 MS. JOHNSON: "WHEREAS, the Atlantic
4 City Municipal Utilities Authority owns and
5 operates its own Water Department; and

6 "WHEREAS, the maintenance of the water
7 mains is the responsibility of the Said
8 Atlantic City Municipal Utilities Authority;
9 and

10 "WHEREAS, a water main break occurred
11 at the intersection of Georgia Avenue and
12 Fairmount Avenue on or about July 15th, 2021;
13 and

14 "WHEREAS, the 6-inch and 4-inch water
15 mains required a complete shutdown in order to
16 perform repairs at the break at the
17 intersecting streets of Georgia Avenue and
18 Fairmount Avenue; and

19 "WHEREAS, the Atlantic City Municipal
20 Utilities Authority by Resolution #28 of
21 February 16, 2022 hired Arthur R. Henry, Inc.
22 of 3031 Ocean Heights Avenue, Egg Harbor
23 Township, New Jersey to provide labor, tools
24 and equipment to repair the 4-inch water
25 main..." in the amount of \$7,040.00.

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

2 MS. JOHNSON: For payment -- I'm sorry

3 --

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Continue.

5 MS. JOHNSON: -- for payment to Garrison
6 Enterprises for all above labor.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: So --

8 MS. JOHNSON: It was an amendment to
9 the original contract.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Yes. The
11 original we did with Faris (phonetic), correct?

12 MS. JOHNSON: The original --

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: Or Henry.

14 MS. JOHNSON: Right. And then had to
15 pay Garrison --

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

17 MS. JOHNSON: -- for the additional
18 work.

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Then we had to pay
20 Garrison to do the work.

21 MS. JOHNSON: Right.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: So that's why we have
23 in front of us today Garrison now --

24 MS. JOHNSON: Yes.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- correct?

1 MS. JOHNSON: Yes.

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Comments or questions?

3 (No response.)

4 CHAIRMAN HILL: Other than my question
5 which was answered. Thank you.

6 Okay, \$7,040.00 for this amendment, can
7 I have a motion?

8 MR. KAUSAR: Motion.

9 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

11 Second?

12 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, me. I'm
13 second.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Roll call.

15 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

16 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

17 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

19 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

1 agreements. These are people or property owners,
2 developers, residents that are going to come to us
3 for a shared [sic] service agreement.

4 The first one is 332 North Richmond
5 Avenue.

6 MR. WARD: It's a service agreement.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: It's a service
8 agreement.

9 MR. WARD: You said shared.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, did I say shared?
11 No, just a service agreement. We're not -- shared is
12 next. We're just doing service agreement for 332
13 North Richmond Avenue.

14 Ms. Johnson, can you read it?

15 MS. JOHNSON: "BE IT RESOLVED, by Board
16 of Directors to of the Atlantic City Municipal
17 Utilities Authority that the Chairman is
18 hereby authorized to execute and the Vice
19 Chairman to attest to the Water Service
20 Agreement by and between the ATLANTIC CITY
21 MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY, with an address
22 of 335 North Annapolis Avenue for Joseph
23 Iannaccone - Owner, for the property bounded
24 by the unit block of premises in the City of
25 Atlantic City at 332 North Richmond Avenue,

1 Block 354, Lot 304."

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

3 And this, of course, will give them
4 connection to our system.

5 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH:
6 That's right, connection fee/service agreement.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Correct.

8 And right out of our regulations and
9 our book so the numbers are the numbers are the
10 numbers.

11 So we're going to move on that 33 --
12 oh, anybody else have a comment or question?

13 (No response.)

14 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Are
15 you going to read the total?

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: The total? Yes, I
17 believe she did that \$4,639.23. Okay. That is what
18 we will be receiving.

19 So we will move to approve this.

20 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: But
21 the 15,000.

22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, you want the total.

19 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

21 Our next one is also a service
22 agreement for a different address, 913 North Indiana
23 Avenue Resolution 11c(2).

24 Can you read the resolution please?

25 MS. JOHNSON: "BE IT RESOLVED, by the

1 Board of Directors of the Atlantic City
2 Municipal Utilities Authority that the
3 Chairman is hereby authorized to execute and
4 the Vice Chairman/Secretary to attest to the
5 Water Service Agreement by and between the
6 Atlantic City Municipal Utilities Authority
7 and the Atlantic City New Jersey Congregation
8 of Jehovah's Witnesses, with an address of
9 920 North Dr. Martin Luther King Boulevard,
10 Atlantic City, New Jersey, for property
11 bounded by the unit block of premises in the
12 City of Atlantic City at 913 North Indiana
13 Avenue, Block 614, Lot 1 and Block 615, Lot 1,
14 in the amount to receive from them in the
15 amount of \$13,928.17."

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

17 Discussion or comments?

18 (No response.)

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: I do -- I know this
20 property. I know where it's located. So you will --
21 I know Ms. Langford lives kind of in that area too.

22 I'm assuming they're expanding?

23 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: No,
24 they're not.

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: What are they doing?

1 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: They
2 actually have a parking lot that is actually --

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh.

4 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: --
5 which they've actually done some landscaping as well
6 too and they need service.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: So that's -- they're
8 not expanding just for extra --

9 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Yes.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: That's fine. They'll
11 take the water. We'll take -- that's fine.

12 The total is \$13,928.17.

13 Any other questions?

14 (No response.)

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Can we have a motion to
16 accept?

17 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Motion.

18 MS. DAVIES: Second.

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: And a second by
20 Ms. Davies.

21 Thank you.

22 Roll call?

23 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

24 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

25 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

2 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

10 Agreement that's the new word everybody loves around
11 here. We're sharing all of our -- our work and some
12 of our expenses which is good. This is for the ACUA,
13 which does an amazing job in our area for laboratory
14 services. I am not sure if this could be just a
15 renewal because they've done -- we've worked with
16 them before.

17 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: Yes.
18 It's a continuation of our Service Agreement, Shared
19 Service Agreement.

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: I remember that.

21 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: It's
22 an annual Shared Service Agreement.

23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.

24 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: So,
25 therefore, this is a renewal.

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: That's what I thought.
2 All right. So it is a renewal. Very
3 good.

4 Can we read the resolution?

5 MS. JOHNSON: "WHEREAS, there exists a
6 need by the Atlantic City Municipal Utilities
7 Authority to have certain laboratory testing
8 services; and

9 "WHEREAS, the Atlantic County Utilities
10 Authority's laboratory facilities are suitable
11 for water and other laboratory testing
12 activities; and

13 "WHEREAS, the Atlantic County Utilities
14 Authority, 6700 Delilah Road, Egg Harbor
15 Township, New Jersey, provides such testing
16 services and is willing to assist the Atlantic
17 City Municipal Utilities Authority in such
18 services beginning June 1, 2022 until May 31,
19 2023."

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.
21 Questions?

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Comments?

24 (No response.)

25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Motion to move?

1 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: I move it.

2 MS. DAVIES: I'll move it.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Motion by Mr. Dedar.

4 And we have a second by Ms. Davies.

5 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

6 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SMITH: I
7 just want to read it and spell it, No. 2.

8 MS. JOHNSON: Yes.

9 "2. The Atlantic City Municipal
10 Utilities Authority will compensate Atlantic
11 County Utilities Authority for Shared Services
12 for Laboratory Testing Services, in the sum
13 not to exceed \$30,268.80."

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you for putting
15 that in the record.

16 MS. JOHNSON: Thank you.

17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

18 Okay. We do have a motion and a
19 second.

20 Let's do roll call.

21 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

22 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

23 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

25 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

1 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

2 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

3 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

4 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Kausar?

5 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

6 CHAIRMAN HILL: Moving on to 11e, I
7 believe this is something that we're working with our
8 consultant Mr. Ratala (phonetic). He's been very
9 busy. He's been very busy in the city. So before we
10 move on -- well, let's read it first and then we'll
11 have discussion. Okay.

12 Ms. Johnson?

13 MS. JOHNSON: "WHEREAS, the New Jersey
14 Department of Environmental Protection and the
15 New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust
16 are accepting applications for the
17 Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing
18 Program; and

19 "WHEREAS, this program is intended to
20 fund water, sewer and stormwater projects;
21 and

22 "WHEREAS, the Atlantic City Municipal
23 Utilities Authority considers funding programs
24 that assist the City in achieving projects
25 that are priorities for the Authority."

1 "NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that
2 Claude Smith, Authority Engineer, be
3 authorized to act as the Authorized
4 Representative to represent Authority in all
5 matters relating to the projects undertaken
6 pursuant to the above referenced New Jersey
7 Environmental Infrastructure Loan to be
8 executed with the New Jersey Department of
9 Environmental Protection and the New Jersey
10 Environmental Infrastructure Trust. The
11 Authorized Representative may be contacted by
12 mail at the Atlantic City Municipal Utilities
13 Authority, 401 North Virginia Avenue,
14 Atlantic City."

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. So this is -- in
16 is important for us looking to get some water to help
17 the engineer. Mr. Ratala is a consultant. I am
18 going to -- Mr. Smith, of course, has his hands full.
19 It looks like you're going to be on top of this. Do
20 you -- I think it might be a good idea to have
21 Mr. Ratala give -- call or just show up and explain
22 where we are in the process.

23 You had to do a lot of stuff in the
24 beginning, but now we're moving forward.

25 Would you agree, Mr. Armstrong?

1 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: I'll
2 make sure -- yes.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Next meeting.

4 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Is it okay.

6 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Yes.

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Just to get, from our
8 consultant, where we stand, what are the goods,
9 what's the bad.

10 And I also think if Mr. -- if you need
11 to call Mr. Ward to review it, once you get
12 something, you know, just --

13 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: No
14 problem.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: To make sure he reviews
16 everything.

17 MR. WARD: Sure.

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

19 Anybody else, comments or questions?

20 (No response.)

21 CHAIRMAN HILL: That was my comment.

22 Sorry. Okay.

23 And we need a motion to move this.

24 I'll move it.

25 A second?

1 MS. DAVIES: Second.

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Davies, thank you.

3 Roll call.

4 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar?

5 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

6 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill?

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

8 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford?

9 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

10 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies?

11 MS. DAVIES: Yes.

12 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Kausar?

13 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

15 We have a leave of absence, one

16 Ms. Kelley Williams who we miss desperately.

17 So we're going to read that resolution.

18 MS. JOHNSON: "WHEREAS, it has been

19 deemed to be in the best interest of the

20 employees of the Atlantic City Municipal

21 Utilities Authority that periodically the

22 Board of Directors grant unpaid leave of

23 absence for need to certain employees; and

24 "WHEREAS, a request has been made by

25 Kelley Williams, employee of the Atlantic City

1 Municipal Utilities Authority for an unpaid
2 leave of abstain; and

3 "WHEREAS" -- I'm sorry.

4 "NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by
5 the Board of Directors of the Atlantic City
6 Municipal Utilities Authority that Kelley
7 Williams, an employee of the Atlantic City
8 Municipal Utilities Authority, is formally
9 granted an unpaid leave of absence from
10 April 1st, 2022 until June 15th, 2022;
11 however, the time frame may be expanded by
12 further action by the Board of Directors."

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Thank you.

14 Comments?

15 (No response.)

16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Questions?

17 (No response.)

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: I'd just like to say if
19 we could just extend our best to Kelley. And we move
20 forward from there.

21 If somebody could reach out to her.

22 Okay. We need a motion to accept.

23 MS. LANGFORD: Motion.

24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Langford made the
25 motion.

1 A second?

2 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Second.

17 I think Mr. Kausar also, yes, definitely go together.
18 It's fine.

19 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: What
20 about -- what about after the next meeting? The next
21 meeting in May shortly after while everybody's
22 already together.

23 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

24 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: -- does
25 that sound like a good day.

1 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes, yes. Sounds
2 good, Mr. Mike.

3 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: You're
4 good.

5 Mr. Kausar, that's okay with you.

6 MR. KAUSAR: Yes.

7 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.
8 Then we just have to hear from Mr. Banfield.

9 The second thing I want to confirm is
10 that everybody is using MUA e-mail address.

11 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Yes.

12 CHAIRMAN HILL: No.

13 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: I got it, I just
14 talk with Claude Smith yesterday for password. So I
15 got it. Yes, I do.

16 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.
17 Because as of today we're not going to send any more
18 e-mails to your personal e-mail address.

19 CHAIRMAN HILL: No problem.

20 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: So we
21 just want to make sure you don't miss out on
22 anything.

23 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: All right.

24 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: I know
25 you are set up too.

1 MS. LANGFORD: Not yet, no.

2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Nor me. I've had
3 trouble with mine too. So --

4 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: We're all in the same
6 boat here. We will work it out, though.

7 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes.

9 And I thank you. And, again, that was
10 something that our -- our board members here brought
11 to our attention and rightfully so.

12 So thank you so much.

13 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: Okay.

14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Mr. Vice
15 Chair.

16 Have a great day.

17 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Thank you,
18 Mr. Chairman. And thank you everyone. See you next
19 meeting.

20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

21 VICE CHAIRMAN DEDAR: Thank you. Have
22 a good day. Bye bye.

23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you.

24 (Whereupon, Vice Chairman Dedar leaves
25 the meeting at 11:06 a.m.)

1 CHAIRMAN HILL: So we need to pay the
2 bills for the MUA. So we're going to look for a
3 motion please.

4 MS. DAVIES: Moved.

5 CHAIRMAN HILL: And a second?

6 MS. LANGFORD: Second.

7 MS. JOHNSON: We already approved it.

8 CHAIRMAN HILL: The bills?

9 MS. JOHNSON: We approved the bills.

10 MR. WARD: No, we didn't.

11 MS. JOHNSON: Oh, no, we didn't. I'm
12 sorry.

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: And we're going to have
14 a second?

15 MS. LANGFORD: Second.

24 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: It's

25 always in the form of a motion.

1 MS. JOHNSON: No resolution a motion
2 only.

3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay.

4 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARMSTRONG: It's up
5 to you, but I don't think you need it. I know in the
6 past --

7 CHAIRMAN HILL: What do you think?
8 Whatever you want to do. You guys --

9 MS. JOHNSON: No resolution.

10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Guys, I think we're
11 going to make a motion to adjourn.

12 MS. LANGFORD: Motion.

13 CHAIRMAN HILL: A second?

14 MR. KAUSAR: Second.

15 CHAIRMAN HILL: All in favor?

16 (Whereupon, all present members respond
17 in the affirmative.)

18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Have a great weekend.
19 Thank you so much for your time. And we will see
20 you. Thank you.

21 (Whereupon, the meeting is concluded.)
