PARTICIPATION IN THE NEW JERSEY WATER ASSOCIATION APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM FOR WATER OPERATIONS SPECIALISTS

BY ALL MEMBERS OF THE BOARD:

WHEREAS, pursuant to regulations of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), the Atlantic City Municipal Utilities Authority (Authority) is required to employ appropriately trained and licensed personnel in the Water Treatment and Water Distribution Facilities; and

WHEREAS, the field of eligible Water Operations Specialists is retracting nationally due to the lack of a strong education to workforce pathway, the retirement of many career specialists and the modest wages associated with the field; and

WHEREAS, the Authority's operations have been impacted by the current labor market conditions, including the loss of personnel to competitor water utilities and the need to offer increased overtime to compensate for insufficient staffing; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that it meets its obligations under the NJDEP Regulations, the Authority has had to engage the firm of Water Resource Management (WRM) to supply individuals on-site who maintain the proper licensing and can assist in Plant and Distribution operations; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Water Association (NJWA), in response to the national shortage of Licensed Water Operators, has established a federally approved Water Operations Apprenticeship Program where individuals receive 4,000 hours of mentored on-the-job training and 288 hours of related technical instructions over the course of two (2) years; and

WHEREAS, the Authority's In-house Apprenticeship Program is not yielding sufficient candidates to fulfill its urgent need and becoming a participant in the NJWA Program will create new recruitment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the standards of the NJWA Program meet both Federal and State requirements for Licensed Water Operators, thus ensuring a pool of highly trained individuals for the available positions; and

WHEREAS, for its commitment to supply the requisite supervision, on-the-job training and incremental wage increases over the course of the apprenticeship, the Authority will receive up to a maximum of Eight Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$8,000.00) per apprentice to help offset the cost of training; and

WHEREAS, the Authority must execute a formal agreement to become an Employer Sponsor of the NJWA Apprenticeship Program.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman is authorized to execute and the Vice Chairman/Deputy to attest the attached agreement.

BY ALL MEMBERS OF THE BOARD:

WHEREAS, the Atlantic City Municipal Utilities Authority (the "Authority") owns and operates the Water Department in the City of Atlantic City, NJ; and

WHEREAS, the maintenance of the water distribution system is the responsibility of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, A 12-inch water main break occurred on Huron Avenue (Route 87) between Brigantine Boulevard (Route 187) and Route 30 on January 26, 2022, causing the road to be flooded and a call for emergency actions to be taken; and

WHEREAS, South Jersey Transportation Authority ("SJTA") has jurisdiction over the maintenance and operation of Huron Avenue (Route 87); and

WHEREAS, SJTA took immediate action and deployed South State Inc. contractor to implement traffic control setting up along with New Jersey State Troopers on Huron Avenue (Route 87); and

WHEREAS, South State Inc. provided emergency repair work to the water main break and emergency restoration the roadway; and

WHEREAS, additional emergency road repair work was of a necessity to completely restore the damages caused by the water main break, which included Ground Penetration Radar (GPR), excavation, compaction, backfilling and asphalt pavement restoration; and

WHEREAS, public health and safety demanded that work be done as soon as possible, and

WHEREAS, the cost and work performed by South State Inc. Contractor, Remington & Vernick Engineers, as well as SJTA are detailed in the attachment provided by South Jersey Transportation Authority;
