Page 2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Adequate 1 notice of this meeting has been provided as required 2 3 by law by mailing to The Press the list -- the list of the regularly scheduled meeting of March 15th, 4 5 2023, at 401 North Virginia Avenue, Conference Room, Atlantic City, New Jersey. A copy of said notice 6 7 was sent to the City Clerk to be posted. All of the aforesaid complies with Chapter 231 of the Laws of 8 9 1975, known as the Open Meeting -- Open Public 10 Meetings Law. Thank you. Roll call. 11 12 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill? CHAIRMAN HILL: Present. 13 14 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar is absent. 15 CHAIRMAN HILL: No. MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Banfield's not 16 17 present at the moment. 18 Ms. Langford? 19 MS. LANGFORD: Here. MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Eccles? 20 21 MR. ECCLES: Here. 22 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies? 23 MS. DAVIES: Here. MS. JOHNSON: And Mr. Kausar? 24 MR. KAUSAR: Yes. 25



Page 3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. I'm going 1 to ask Mr. Eccles if he could lead us in the flag 2 3 salute. MR. ECCLES: Certainly. Thank you. 4 5 (The Pledge of Allegiance is 6 recited.) 7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Mr. 8 Eccles. 9 Before we get started, I just wanted to make notice of, and I'd like them just to say 10 hello so we know who they are. We have Remington & 11 12 Vernick on this meeting. We had an engineering meeting last week. I asked them to be part of the 13 14 board meeting because, as we know, we're going 15 through a transition with Mr. Smith leaving. There's a lot going on with our -- with our special 16 17 engineering firm. 18 So, guys, could you just introduce 19 yourself and say hello? These are the board members and some very vital people of our administration, 20 21 including the person who pays you. 22 MR. ECCLES: You better know them. 23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. You better know her. 24 Ed, could you start? 25



Page 4 MR. DENNIS: Absolutely. And thank 1 you, Gary. And I apologize my camera's not on. 2 3 It's not working this morning. CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. 4 5 MR. DENNIS: Just envision a very But I'm happy to be here, happy to 6 handsome man. introduce myself. I've met some of you in person. 7 I'm happy to meet the board. 8 9 My name's Ed Dennis. I'm a principal at Remington & Vernick Engineers, and I do have with 10 me here today Ryan Hayes from my office. He can 11 12 introduce himself real quick, and then Bob Smith who's still trying to sign on, so I'm going to get 13 14 him the link. 15 But, Ryan, why don't you just go ahead and introduce yourself? 16 17 MR. HAYES: Hello, and good morning, 18 everybody. Thank you for having me on the call. My name's Ryan Hayes. I'm with Remington & Vernick, an 19 engineer, and happy to be here this morning. 20 21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Ryan. And 22 then as -- as Mr. Dennis said, Bob Smith will be 23 joining us, too, from Remington & Vernick, and we've been working very closely with them a couple of 24 months now, and we'll continue so in the future. 25



Page 5 Thanks, guys, for being here. 1 Okay. Ms. Johnson, do we have any 2 3 public participation as of this moment? MS. JOHNSON: No, we do not. 4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Then we'll move on to the approval of the minutes. 6 We did not have closed session last month, so we're just going 7 to be looking at and reviewing and voting on the 8 open minutes for February. 9 10 So, Ms. Johnson, could you read that resolution, please? 11 12 MS. JOHNSON: Approving the open session minutes of February the 15th, 2023. 13 14 Whereas, the Atlantic City Municipal Utilities 15 Authority held their board meeting on February 15th, 2023. 16 17 Now therefore be it resolved, that on 18 this day, the 15th of March 2023, the board of directors of the MUA hereby approves the transcript 19 of the open session meeting minutes of February 20 15th, 2023. 21 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. Any 23 changes, editions, or edits? Hearing none, I'll look for a motion 24 25 to accept.



Page 6 MR. ECCLES: I'll make a motion. 1 CHAIRMAN HILL: 2 Thank you. 3 And a second? MS. LANGFORD: Second. 4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. Roll call. 6 7 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill? 8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes. 9 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford? MS. LANGFORD: Yes. 10 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Eccles? 11 12 MR. ECCLES: Yes. MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies? 13 14 MS. DAVIES: Yes. 15 MS. JOHNSON: And Mr. Kausar? MR. KAUSAR: Yes. 16 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you all. 18 Before we move on to Bruce's report, I just wanted to again extend sympathies to Ms. Johnson, our board 19 20 secretary, who lost a family member right after our 21 last board member (sic), and on behalf of the board and the staff of the MUA, Stella, we -- we're very 22 23 sorry for your loss. MS. JOHNSON: And I thank you all for 24 your flowers and your cards and acknowledgment. 25 Ι



Page 7 appreciate it. Thank you very much. 1 2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Of course. Thank 3 you. Okay. Mr. Ward, our board solicitor, 4 5 you're on. Do you have anything that you'd like to update the board and/or the committee here? 6 7 MR. WARD: Yes. Only to acknowledge that Claude Smith is going to be retiring. I think 8 9 we all want to wish Claude a very successful transition. 10 However, I think we need to recognize 11 12 that a very important institutional knowledge is leaving the authority. Claude's been around --13 14 How many years, Claude? 15 MR. SMITH: 31 years plus. CHAIRMAN HILL: Wow. 16 17 MR. SMITH: 31 years plus. 18 MR. ECCLES: Whoa. 19 CHAIRMAN HILL: That's why you lost some of your hair. 20 21 MR. WARD: Yes. MR. SMITH: No. That's why it's 22 23 becoming gray. CHAIRMAN HILL: There you go. There 24 25 you go.



Page 8 But we'll all hold our MR. WARD: 1 2 arms together and try to fill this major gap in his 3 exit. And, Claude, we wish you the best, 4 5 very best. 6 MR. SMITH: Thank you very much. Ι 7 appreciate that. 8 MR. WARD: Uh-huh. 9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Claude has been an outstanding staff member and worked very hard. 10 Нe takes everything serious. He is working in close 11 12 contact with Remington & Vernick, just for the rest of the board members. 13 Anything else, Bruce? 14 15 MR. WARD: That's it. 16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Very good. We're 17 going to go on to, speaking of Mr. Smith, the 18 engineering committee. As I said, we had one -- we had one recently. We are trying to put all of the 19 20 pieces together. Engineering reports are very 21 important. Again, I advise all board members to 22 look over that. It gives you an idea of our 23 projects, our monies, who's involved, and hopefully deadlines and completion dates. That is the 24 25 engineering committee.



Page 9 Before we do that, Mr. Banfield, 1 hello. Welcome. 2 3 MR. BANFIELD: Good morning. Sorry I'm late. 4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: That's okay. We're just a moving, you know. That's fine, Glenn. 6 7 Okay. Claude, you're up. 8 MR. SMITH: Yeah. As you said, Gary, 9 that we have been working -- working closely with Remington & Vernick in the last couple weeks in 10 regards to some of the engineering projects that are 11 12 existent and have actually been ongoing and probably will be in the future, as well, too, that's coming 13 14 up. 15 Of course the report is still a work in progress, and I'm trying to add things to it as I 16 go along just so that at least the board will 17 18 actually have that information, as well as the administrative office will actually have that 19 20 information available to them in regards to what's actually ongoing. 21 We have a meeting that's going to be 22 23 coming up again with Remington & Vernick. As a matter of fact, next week Friday we'll be definitely 24 meeting, and there's a possibility that we might be 25



Page 10 meeting tomorrow. 1 2 Is that correct, Ryan? 3 MR. HAYES: Yes. That's -- that's I wanted to sit down and talk with the correct. 4 5 ACMUA staff about the -- I think the recent email you sent this week about forewarning (phon) projects 6 7 and GIS. 8 MR. SMITH: So -- so, again, as I 9 said, everything is actually still a work in progress, and we are working closely with Remington 10 & Vernick just to transition some of the -- the 11 projects and so forth that's ongoing, so that's 12 pretty much it. If -- if --13 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. 15 MR. SMITH: -- the board members actually review the reports and they have any 16 questions, by all means, if they can reach out or if 17 18 they can -- of course I won't be here for the next board meeting, but if there's any questions that 19 20 they have, if they can direct them to the office, 21 and we can try to at least address them, or if they 22 can address them to you, Gary, and then you can 23 actually inquire, and then we can actually address it as best as we can. 24 25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. And we'll



Page 11 probably call on somebody from Remington if in case 1 I don't know all of the engineering stuff, which I 2 3 don't. Even though I've done this for like 15 years, I'm still learning, but I'm not an engineer. 4 5 Also, Claude, just -- just for my own clarification, when do you think we might get the 6 7 updated report? 8 MR. SMITH: Well, as -- as I go 9 along, I'm actually updating the report. As a matter of fact, I just thought about some more stuff 10 that I would be putting on there. For instance, one 11 12 of the other items that I'll be definitely putting on there is the cradle project --13 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 15 MR. SMITH: -- cradle projects that 16 we have actually worked on and still actually are working on it. We do have an outstanding contract, 17 18 as you -- as you can say, with an engineering company, which is actually Van Cleef that we need to 19 20 at least address. So I'll be putting that on there so at least you have that awareness of that 21 particular project. I just thought about that this 22 23 week, as well, too, in regards to that information. CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Thank you. 24 25 MR. ARMSTRONG: Also -- also with



Page 12 respect to the update, Anita gave us a -- I think it 1 was an Excel report when we first -- Claude first 2 did his engineering report last year, and it gave us 3 an indication of how much money was spent towards 4 5 each project so that we could see where we were in relation to the -- you know, the project being 6 7 completed. Anita, do you think you can take a 8 look at the remaining open projects and give us 9 another update? 10 MS. THAPA: Sure. 11 12 MR. ARMSTRONG: Okay. CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Anybody else 13 14 have something for Mr. Smith? Okay. We might hear 15 from him again. 16 All right. Personnel committee. Mr. Dedar is not here. He's chairman of that committee, 17 18 but I think there's one item here. Mr. Armstrong, would you like to 19 address that? 20 21 MR. ARMSTRONG: We -- we can talk 22 about it in closed session. 23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. And I also think we want to welcome somebody new, correct --24 25 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yes.



Page 13 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- that finally came 1 onboard? 2 3 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yes. CHAIRMAN HILL: Would you like to 4 5 introduce her? I mean, we all know her and we -- do 6 you want to --7 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yes. Karen Upshall 8 was brought on to work and assist with our personnel 9 department. So far she's been here for about a week, and she's been very helpful to us in a lot of 10 the issues that we're facing. In fact, she's 11 12 meeting with Mike Riley now discussing some issues that are pending in the conference room. 13 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: I'm assuming, Ms. 15 Still, you've met with Karen, as well; right? 16 MS. STILL: Yes, I have. Regularly 17 we interact. 18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Very good. Thanks. All right. We're going to --19 20 MR. ARMSTRONG: And --21 CHAIRMAN HILL: We're going to move 22 on to Mr. Armstrong's report. 23 MR. ARMSTRONG: Just one other thing, and it was also personnel matters under me. So I'll 24 just mention one other thing is that Kevin Jennings 25



Page 14 who retired as assistant manager --1 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 2 3 MR. ARMSTRONG: -- he decided to come back to the authority, and today is his first day 4 5 back at the authority. CHAIRMAN HILL: Kevin's a great 6 7 asset. 8 MR. ARMSTRONG: Right. 9 CHAIRMAN HILL: I'm really glad to see him back personally. 10 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yeah. Yeah. He's 11 12 back on a part-time basis, 24 hours a week. CHAIRMAN HILL: Part time, right. 13 14 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yep. Other than 15 that, I don't have anything under the executive director's report. 16 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. We might have 18 one or two items maybe in closed session. If not --19 MR. ARMSTRONG: Right. CHAIRMAN HILL: -- we'll move 20 21 forward. 22 The deputy executive director of 23 engineering, we talked about the engineering operations report from the plant. I don't see Larry 24 25 here.



Page 15 Claude, do you want to say anything 1 there that we should maybe be aware of? 2 3 MR. SMITH: One of the things I will mention is that the EPA report that we received for 4 5 a response -- response to concerns, that he's currently working on. As a matter of fact, it's --6 it's a work in progress. That particular report is 7 due back to the EPA on the 22nd of this month. So I 8 9 know Larry's actually still working on it. 10 He did supply me with some -- some portions of the report where he wanted some input on 11 12 those sections of the report. And I'll be talking with him. We should be actually meeting with him 13 today, if possible, so that's --14 15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. I thought --I thought you had a meeting this afternoon maybe? 16 17 MR. SMITH: Right. That's what I 18 said. Today -- today -- yes. Today -- today after the -- probably around 3:00 or so we probably will 19 20 be meeting with Larry, but in regards to any particular operations with the plant, of course 21 22 everything is still ongoing. There's -- as far as 23 I'm concerned, there's no issues. There's one thing on here -- I'll 24 jump forward in regards to we just went out and got 25



Page 16 bids for corrosion inhibitor chemicals. Tt's 1 actually on here. It's actually item number 10. 2 3 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. MR. SMITH: So I'm just letting you 4 5 know that, you know, the chemical supplies is something that's definitely still important to the 6 authority. Of course this is just one of the 7 chemical usage that the plant does need, and of 8 9 course, there will be more in the upcoming months or year that definitely would have to be gone out 10 for -- for proposals and for bids. So just to keep 11 12 that in mind as we proceed through the operation process of the treatment plant. 13 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. I was 15 remiss. I apologize. All of you should have received -- I should have done this in my report --16 committee assignments and a schedule including with 17 18 the board from Ms. Johnson. Thank you, Stella. 19 Just so everybody's aware, that is of course flexible because there are sometimes issues, 20 21 we need to add a meeting or we eliminate a meeting. 22 For instance, engineering's going to be having a few 23 meetings more than what's listed there because of the transition with Mr. Smith. I hope everybody had 24 reviewed it. 25



Page 17 I did speak in the beginning of the 1 year with most board members. We're kind of leaving 2 3 everything status quo for this year, so just to make sure that you receive that. If you did not, Ms. 4 5 Johnson can send that to you. I'm sorry about it. 6 I should have told you that earlier. 7 Okay. We're going to be moving to the deputy executive director of administration, Ms. 8 9 Still. I know you've been very busy doing a lot of things. 10 Okay. Yeah. 11 12 MS. STILL: You have a fly on the 13 wall. 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. 15 MS. STILL: Yes. Good -- good morning, everyone. So with Claude's transition, 16 17 I've just been trying to jump in and liaise a little 18 bit with the engineers and with WRM. 19 We've also, separate from that, have 20 started a comprehensive review of the rules and regs 21 document looking to see if we can just update some 22 of the language and go -- take a deeper dive into 23 some of the fees that have been charged over the years. You know, they need to be updated with 24 25 respect to the costs that we're paying out for



Page 18 certain work. 1 And today I forgot to talk to Edie 2 3 Armstrong about this, but we do have a meeting at 2:00 with Patrick -- Patrick Quinlan from the city. 4 5 That shared services agreement was executed and returned to us about two weeks ago, and so Patrick's 6 going to come over and pick up where he left off to 7 8 talk with us about IT needs. 9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Right. That took us a while to get that, but it seems like we're 10 in much closer relationship and better --11 12 everything's clearer, correct, India, than it was originally? 13 14 MS. STILL: I think so with respect 15 to how this will work. I'm laughing. 16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Mr. 17 Armstrong's laughing, too, but you know... 18 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yeah. That's -that's a closed session discussion. 19 CHAIRMAN HILL: That is. 20 That is. 21 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yeah. 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: And I'll have to get 23 at Mr. Quinlan if he doesn't get his act together. He and I --24 25 MS. STILL: I work with Pat on a



Page 19 regular basis on some other --1 2 CHAIRMAN HILL: I've got it. 3 MS. STILL: -- on other things, too, so we have a good relationship. 4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. Yeah. He's a -- he's a good guy. 6 7 MS. STILL: Yeah. 8 CHAIRMAN HILL: He has a lot of hats 9 on, too, so --10 MS. STILL: He does. CHAIRMAN HILL: -- you know, I get 11 12 it. Okay. Anything else, Ms. Still? 13 14 MS. STILL: No. Thank you. 15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you so very much. 16 17 We're going to go to D on our agenda, 18 accounting and finances. We don't need to vote on any of this, but this is really for information and 19 20 review. It's on the agenda every -- every month, 21 and we'll start with Ms. Anita Thapa. 22 MS. THAPA: Okay. Good morning. 23 Good morning, everyone. Okay. The financial reports are for the month of January. Okay. So 24 just for the reviews -- brief review, as we know --25



Page 20 we know that we have increased our rate -- flat 1 rates in 2023 by 8 percent. So with that increase, 2 for January revenue, as compared to last year, our 3 revenue's up by 9 percent. So total revenue in 4 5 January is 1.6 million. And our operating expenses for January, it's about 886,000. 6 7 As for the cash collection, we collected about 1.3 million including 10,038 --8 9 about 10,000 in connection fees. As for the cash management, the 10 interest rate is averaging about 4 percent. 11 As we 12 all probably are aware of the -- the recent news with the bank failure, hopefully the interest rates 13 will be, you know, going up as -- as usually it's 14 15 going up. So hopefully that -- that will be the 16 case. Like I said, I had mentioned in 17 18 earlier, too, I've been looking into maybe invest in the New Jersey Cash Management, which we have 19 invested about 3 million. Their rate is a little 20 bit higher than our Bank of New York Mellon, just 21 like a maybe point -- a quarter difference there, so 22 23 I'm still looking into whether to invest or not, but those amounts -- I mean, those investments also will 24 25 be in the money market, so it is -- we can withdraw



Page 21 as we -- you know, as we need for our capital 1 2 projects. 3 So hopefully -- I think -- I just checked the interest rate, and it's about 4.5. So 4 5 if it keeps like this, then maybe this month or next month -- month, Ms. Still and I will look over and 6 7 then we'll -- we will invest in that cash -- New Jersey Cash Management Fund. I believe that the New 8 9 Jersey Cash Management Fund is -- it's pretty -- you know, it's working pretty good. 10 So --And for the balance adjustment and 11 12 shutoffs, that's just for the information. As we know, we will not be doing the shutoff in March, but 13 14 we'll be starting in April --15 CHAIRMAN HILL: April. April. Right. 16 17 MS. THAPA: -- depending on the 18 weather, so -- because the weather is so unpredictable. So depending on the temperature, 19 we'll start shutoffs somewhere between mid-April or 20 May, starting May. Okay? 21 And that's it for the financials. 22 23 And if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call me. 24 25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Anita.



Page 22 Once again, great job. 1 2 Okay. We're going to be moving into 3 10 on our agenda, which is old business. Mr. Smith already spoke about -- a little bit about 10 a (1). 4 5 I'm going to ask Ms. Johnson to read that resolution, please. 6 7 MS. JOHNSON: Corrosion inhibitor chemical, Carus, LLC. Be it resolved, by the board 8 9 of directors of the Atlantic City MUA that the bid of Carus, LLC for furnishing and delivering 10 corrosion inhibitor chemicals, which the bid was 11 12 received publicly and open and read at a meeting of the purchasing board held on March 7th, 2023, is 13 14 hereby accepted from Carus in the amount of \$262,560. 15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. And, of 16 course, this is the chemicals we need to do our 17 18 work. 19 So anybody have a question, comment? 20 MR. WARD: Yes. Mr. Hill --21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes. 22 MR. WARD: -- the price for the 23 corrosion inhibitor is 125 percent more than previous years. 24 25 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right.



Page 23 MR. WARD: And it's the result of a 1 supply chain issue that arose in August of 2022 2 3 where a facility in North Carolina had an accident and had to be shut down. So we're limping along 4 5 with a company coming out of Illinois, which, you know, was the successful bidder, but again, just so 6 people know, these are some supply chain issues --7 8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 9 MR. WARD: -- that we have to respond to, yet this chemical is drastically needed by the 10 board. 11 12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Thank you. I was going to mention the cost increase was quite a 13 14 bit. I mean, it's --15 MR. WARD: Yes. 16 MR. SMITH: Just to add to that, at 17 this point the fact that there --18 CHAIRMAN HILL: I'm sorry. There's a little interference. 19 MR. ARMSTRONG: Could everybody mute 20 21 their mics? 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Can you mute? 23 Thanks. Go ahead. 24 25 MR. SMITH: Yeah. Just -- just



Page 24 making the comment then despite the fact they're 1 from out of Illinois, this is a company that we've 2 3 dealt with before in the past. Of course, they have been able to successfully deliver this particular 4 5 chemical to us, and I did make Ed Jones and Larry aware of this -- of the change of the chemical 6 company that we would be dealing with for this 7 particular chemical. So they know what to do in 8 9 advance in regards to getting the chemicals for the 10 operations of the treatment plant. CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Good. 11 12 MR. SMITH: And just -- just to inform the board, as well, too, this is 13 14 actually for -- the pricing that you're seeing there 15 is actually for a two-year agreement with the 16 company. It's not just one year. 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, okay. That's 18 good to know. All right. 19 MR. ECCLES: Oh. Thank -- thank you, 20 Claude, for letting us --21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. 22 MR. ECCLES: -- be aware. You know, 23 that's -- that's good news. CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. 24 25 MR. SMITH: Sure.



Page 25 MR. ECCLES: So the contract will be 1 for two years? 2 3 MR. SMITH: That's -- that's correct. MR. ECCLES: Thank you. 4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah.
