Adequate notice of this meeting has been 2 3 provided as required by law by mailing to The Press a list of the regularly scheduled meetings and the 4 5 rescheduled Friday, November 17th, 2023 meeting, at 401 North Virginia Avenue, Conference Room, Atlantic 6 7 City, New Jersey. A copy of said notice was sent to the City Clerk to be posted. All of the aforesaid 8 9 complies with Chapter 231 of the Laws of 1975, known as the Open Public Meetings Law. 10 And we'll do a call to order, please. 11 12 We did. So we'll do roll call. 13 14 MS. ARMSTRONG: Okay. CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. 24 MR. ARMSTRONG: Also, just to be 25

Page 6 beginning, but then it resulted in a lot of Zoom 1 bombing. That's why oftentimes they have you make a 2 3 request, and then they --MS. POST: I'm sorry. What does Zoom 4 5 bombing mean? 6 MR. ARMSTRONG: When someone, anyone 7 comes in like a spammer and then they come in and they take control of your actual meeting and start 8 9 posting offensive material, things like that. They typically characterize it as Zoom bombing. 10 So what they did to try to restrict 11 12 it is to have people to make specific requests and then email them the link so that they can come in to 13 14 avoid the Zoom bombing. 15 MS. I know you have some things 10 in executive session, as well, but we can --11 12 anything in public right now? MR. ARMSTRONG: My mic was off. 13 14 No. 15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Thank you. Okay. And, Cliff, I know we're going 16 17 to be talking a lot about some of the things you 18 guys are doing at the plant, operationals, as well as our projects in the future. 19 Would you like to add anything now 20 21 until we get to those items? 22 MR. KEEN: I can save it until we get 23 to the other items. CHAIRMAN HILL: That's what I 24 25 thought. Very good.



Page 17 And, Ms. Still, I know your -- your 1 hands are in everything. So let's see if there's 2 3 anything you'd like to share with the board in open? MS. STILL: I'm just working right 4 5 now on -- on concluding the negotiations from the contracts and just rewriting, you know, the MOUs, 6 creating clean documents. 7 8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. How are we doing with the salary study that we were initiating? 9 10 MS. STILL: So we -- well, we had -we had some hiccups in getting off the ground with 11 12 the contract, but now we have a meeting set up for next week to do a meet-and-greet and just to -- to 13 start laying out what their next steps are going to 14 15 be. 16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Thank you so 17 much. 18 Moving on to accounting and finance. Anita, we'll go through your reports. They were 19 attached, so hopefully people got to review them. 20 21 Anita, please. 22 MS. THAPA: Okay. Sure. Good 23 morning to all. CHAIRMAN HILL: Good morning. 24 MS. THAPA: So the financials are for 25



Page 18 the month of September. As of September, we 1 collected about 72 percent of the revenue from the 2 user charges, which is about 2 percent, a little bit 3 higher than compared to our budget. Right? Which 4 5 is pretty good or we're at least in line. As for the cash management, we are 6 earning about 5 percent in all of our money 7 8 market -- money market accounts. I haven't invested 9 in anything yet because the interest rate is pretty good in the -- in our trustee accounts. 10 As for the balance adjustment, it's 11 12 just for the review for the board. And shutoffs, obviously, we're not --13 14 we stopped the shutoff since this is a cold winter 15 or, you know, it's -- the weather is on and off, so we stopped it, but the lien is going to -- we have 16 sent our list to the City. And the lien is going to 17 18 be -- will be held on December 18 of this -- which is next month. 19 So everything -- the City's going to 20 handle our lien -- lien list. So it's about 205,000 21 outstanding balances we have sent to the -- to the 22 23 City. Okay? You're muted. 24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Could you repeat that 25



Page 19 number of outstanding? 1 MS. THAPA: Let me see. To be exact, 2 3 we are about 198 -- I mean, 2 -- 206 accounts, and the lien amount totals 278,983. 4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. Thank you. 6 And there's -- so they're aware of that now? 7 MS. THAPA: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Okay. And 9 I'd just --10 Sorry? MS. THAPA: Yeah. I'm good. Sorry. 11 That's mine. 12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, does anybody from 13 14 the board have a question for Anita on finance? 15 Okay. And we'll approve the bills 16 later on in the meeting. 17 Old business. Of course the budget, 18 our 2024 budget has been -- we've been working hard, 19 the committee. I thank Mr. Banfield for leading 20 that, as well as Anita and her people. 21 We're now at the public hearing 22 portion of that before it gets approved in December, 23 and we have a public hearing on Tuesday, November 28th, as well as a rate hearing, which is our rates 24 and regulations for the following year on Tuesday 25



Page 20 November 28th, as well. 1 Anybody who would like to participate 2 3 in that, see Ms. Johnson, so she can send you a link for -- to participate. 4 5 I believe we've already gotten asked for that, right, Stella? You already did that, I 6 7 believe. 8 MS. JOHNSON: Yes. Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Anita, anything to say about the 10 hearings other than what we -- it's annually we do 11 12 that. MS. THAPA: Yes. So like you said, 13 14 it's on Tuesday, November 28th at 10:00. It will be 15 a Zoom meeting, as well. So we did advertise a couple of times there. Okay? 16 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. 18 MS. THAPA: That's about it. 19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Very good. Moving on 20 to 11, our new business. We have a number of things 21 on that. We're going to start with the abatements. 22 This is unnecessary to appear. 23 Again, we have I believe four of 24 those abatements. We can take all of those together because they deal with the same issues. However, 25



Page 21 again, I just urge any board members, if there's a 1 conflict, if you want to abstain or, excuse me, 2 3 recuse yourself from one of them, just let us know when we do the vote. 4 5 So we're going to ask Ms. Johnson to read 11 a, again the addresses and the -- then we'll 6 put them all together in one. 7 8 MS. JOHNSON: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Ms. Johnson, please. MS. JOHNSON: Abatement for Fairmount 10 Corner 2647, LLC, location 2647 Fairmount Avenue, 11 12 the amount of \$1,182.42. Henry Decasablanca located at 2502 13 14 Tindaro Terrace in the amount of \$1,294.78. Michael and Carol Harris located at 15 250 North Pennsylvania Avenue in the amount of 16 17 \$450.01. 18 And lastly, Alejandra Staubs located at 108 North Delancey Place in the amount of 19 \$507.48. 20 21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. And all those 22 resolutions were attached to our emails. 23 So does anybody have a question concerning those abatements? It's general business. 24 25 Hearing none, I'll move those.

JOHNSON: City of Atlantic City appropriations. 24 25 Whereas, on December 21st, 2022, the



Page 23 Atlantic City MUA adopted the annual operating 1 budget and capital budget for the fiscal year 2 3 beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31st, 2023; 4 5 Whereas, the City of Atlantic City has requested payment of the surplus in the 6 authority's budget; 7 8 Whereas, the amount -- maximum amount of money that was appropriated in the authority's 9 2023 budget commencing January 1, 2023 pursuant to 10 the above statute is 810,000 -- I'm sorry --11 12 \$810,359; Now therefore be it resolved, by the 13 14 board of directors of the Atlantic City MUA 15 municipal appropriation payment to the City of Atlantic City in the amount of \$575,064. 16 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: There is -- can we 18 look at that number again? I have 576. 19 MR. WARD: I thought it was 576. 20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 21 MS. JOHNSON: Okay. Thank you. 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Just to make sure. 23 MS. JOHNSON: Correction. CHAIRMAN HILL: All right. 24 Νo problem. 25

So, again, this is by statute, 1 just so we all know that, and this is our annual --2 3 again, I'm using the word donation, but it's our annual contribution to the City of Atlantic City 4 5 from our -- based on the numbers that we read for this year. 6 7 Does anybody have a question? 8 Hearing none, I'll accept a motion. 9 MR. 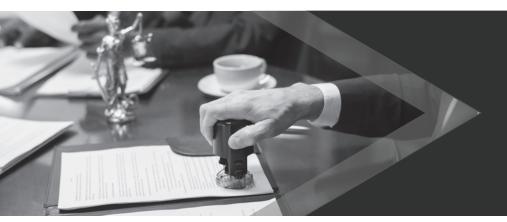
