Page 2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Good morning, 1 2 everybody. 3 Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided as required by law by mailing to The 4 5 Press a list of the regularly scheduled meeting, January 17th, 2024, at 401 North Virginia Avenue, 6 7 Conference Room, Atlantic City, New Jersey. A copy 8 of said notice was sent to the City Clerk to be 9 posted. All of the aforesaid complies with Chapter 10 231 of the Laws of 1975 known as the Open Public Meetings Law. 11 12 So roll call, please? MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill? 13 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes. 15 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar? MR. DEDAR: Yes. 16 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Banfield is absent 17 18 at this moment. 19 Ms. Langford? 20 MS. LANGFORD: Here. 21 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Eccles? 22 MR. ECCLES: Here. 23 MS. And I'll 15 move that. Can we have a second? 16 17 MR. ECCLES: I'll second. 18 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. Roll call. 19 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill? 20 21 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes. 22 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar? 23 MR. DEDAR: Yes. MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford? 24 MS. LANGFORD: Yes. 25

Moving on to the chairman's report. 6 I have three matters I just want to go over. 7 The 8 first one, of course, is what started our new year 9 out as a very important issue that happened, the boil water advisory plan. I believe all of you have 10 seen all the press releases. There -- it's still on 11 our -- or was on the website, as well. 12 We're going to talk a little bit more 13 about that in executive session, but I think we all 14 15 understand how important this issue was. We -- due to immense amount of safety, we wanted to do 16 everything we could possibly do within a short time 17 18 frame to solve the situation of our numbers. And the EPA, in collaboration with 19 our MUA staff, our team, which did an amazing job, 20 21 was guiding us, and I want to specifically thank Ms. 22 Still and Cliff. Mr. Armstrong was not available 23 here. He was available the entire time via phone. He was not feeling very well. I was out of the 24 25 country. However, I was in close contact with Ms.



Page 7 Still in particular and other people and Mr. 1 Armstrong when I got back into the country. 2 3 And I know that there was a lot of things going on at that time, but I really believe 4 5 that they handled everything exceedingly professional. That is why we have professional 6 7 leaders as our team. Board members are -- are not involved 8 9 in solving those problems. We need to be aware of those problems, of course, especially for the 10 community, which we were. And I know there's always 11 12 ways for us to improve things, like communications, and we'll work on that in the future for sure, but 13 when less than 20 -- 48 hours -- excuse me --14 15 we rescinded the boil advisory, as we all know, and we moved forward from there and have had no issues. 16 17 Again, the testing period, as you all 18 know, is over 18 hours, I believe Cliff told me. That's what took us a little bit of a time, nothing 19 20 to do with us. We were fine. The public then was made aware by the Mayor's office and the emergency 21 22 management office under Fire Chief Scott Evans. 23 I did speak with the fire chief, as well, to make sure that he had the cooperation from 24 25 us, and of course, we did -- he did. And then of



Page 8 course we supplied water to our community and to, in 1 2 particular, senior centers, and that was something I 3 thought was exceedingly important that we did, and I thank the people there for making all of those 4 5 things happen. So I'm going to be quiet on that, go 6 7 Does anybody -- would like to make a from there. 8 comment publicly at this point on that issue? 9 Okay. Second of all, I have met with the search committee. This is for our executive 10 director search in December. We've been very busy. 11 12 Right around the holidays this all happened, and Mr. Dedar is chairing that committee along with myself. 13 14 Ms. Davies is our alternate, and Mr. Ward is our --15 of course the attorney. 16 As you saw, or if you looked at our 17 website, the search is there listed. It has been 18 advertised since about Christmastime, I think was the date. It's on Atlantic City Press, the search, 19 the MUA website. It is still there. The New Jersey 20 League of Municipalities website, it will be there 21 22 until the 31st of this month. 23 We did reach out to the AEA. We have not got responses how to do that, so it's out there 24 in the public. Also, there's some -- I know there 25



was a radio report on that, as well. So it is 1 definitely known that we're doing a search. 2 3 The deadline is the 24th of January for resumés, and then the search committee will move 4 5 from there in limiting those resumés down to a pool, and then we'll do interviews and so forth in 6 7 beginning of -- well, in February. We do not have 8 to rush into this. And I made that real clear with 9 the state, and the state confirms with me. I did speak with the state before I left on vacation. 10 So I think we're all in a good shape that we just are 11 12 looking for of course the best candidate that we all believe will serve the MUA. So that's where we are 13 14 with that, and we can discuss that more. 15 Mr. Dedar, would you have anything you'd like to add to that? 16 17 MR. DEDAR: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 18 I mean, you explained good, whatever you said. We already put it on the website, all over, because by 19 myself, I was checking also one of my friend who was 20 interested, and I saw --21 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 23 MR. DEDAR: -- MUA was on the -posted everything, so that's been good. Yeah. 24 We are waiting for the best candidate which will be the 25

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Page 10 best for the MUA and residents for Atlantic City. 1 2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Exactly. And we do 3 have a couple of candidates that have already applied, and again, the deadline's not until the 4 5 24th, so we'll move from there. The third thing's not on here, but it 6 7 kind of goes with this, and I am not sure if any 8 plans have changed, but at this point at public, 9 since we are here in January, I want to thank Mr. Armstrong, in particular, for all of his hard work 10 with the MUA for all of these past years. 11 12 If there's any way he's going to change his move date, that would be amazing. 13 Ι 14 think we can get a pretty good vote on that, but 15 that's no pressure on him, but I just wanted to publicly as chairman to say thank you, Michael, for 16 17 all your hard work and your dedication, and we --18 we've had a lot of issues in front of us. We're still going to have issues, but we thank you for 19 your leadership, your skill, and your personality 20 21 with us. 22 Thank you, Michael. 23 MR. ARMSTRONG: Thank you. Ι appreciate everything that everybody did to support 24 me throughout the last three years. I thoroughly 25



Page 11 enjoyed working with everyone and seeing all the 1 progress that we've made in the last three years 2 both internally with the administration, out at the 3 plant and administration building, distribution, and 4 5 as well as the new members who have come onto the board that I've thoroughly enjoyed meeting and 6 having an opportunity to work with. 7 8 Again, thank you all. 9 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Michael. 10 Moving on. MR. ECCLES: Absolutely. 11 No. 12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. Go ahead, 13 John. 14 MR. ECCLES: I just want to -- I just 15 want to add one thing. Just not -- not to be 16 redundant, but I want to thank Michael for all of his hard work over the years, and I must say 17 18 speaking -- speaking for myself, I have not been this traumatized by a departure since Johnny Carson 19 left The Tonight Show. 20 21 CHAIRMAN HILL: That's pretty big, 22 Michael. I'll tell you. MR. ECCLES: That's big. Here's 23 Michael. I mean... 24 25 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yeah. I was



Page 12 traumatized by that, too, so I understand. 1 MR. ECCLES: I mean, it's -- I mean, 2 3 that last line was in jest, but there's a serious undertone --4 5 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, it was? Okay. MR. ECCLES: -- to it, so... 6 7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Thank you. 8 MR. ARMSTRONG: And I -- and I just want to say, too, in that -- even in the short 9 amount of time that I was there, we've -- what I 10 mean by seeing the changes with respect to the 11 12 staff, we've had, you know, India come on. We've had Cliff come on. We've had Remington come on. 13 Οf course Anita has always done a great job. Stella is 14 15 doing an amazing job as board secretary and -- and Bruce as solicitor, and with his familiarity with 16 the MUA already, that -- that was a big help. 17 And 18 even Wendy, I mean, because if you recall, prior to this, we had some difficulties with our court 19 reporter in the past. 20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, yeah. 21 22 MR. ARMSTRONG: And Wendy has just 23 been amazing, you know, so I mean, just seeing how the board moves so smoothly and with respect to how 24 the chairman runs the board and the deputy chairman, 25



Page 13 as well, it just -- it just is a major difference. 1 It's a place where you feel like you want to be, as 2 opposed to, I have to admit several years ago you 3 kind of considered whether you even wanted to be a 4 5 part of the MUA. And if -- and I'm sure that everybody 6 7 has a clear understanding of, you know, what it was like and don't want to go back there and sees 8 9 what -- everybody sees what it's like now and want to continue to move that way moving forward and keep 10 it, you know, a wonderful place to be and work. 11 12 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you, Michael. Any other board member that would 13 14 like to speak? 15 Okay. Hearing none, we'll move on to the authority solicitor's report. I know he has 16 17 some -- he's been working hard. I'll tell you I've 18 been -- I think I spoke to Bruce more this last month than I have in a year, so -- but he did an 19 amazing job with one of the items we're going to 20 talk about in closed session. 21 22 Bruce, anything else you want to add? 23 MR. WARD: That will be 2514 Fairmount Avenue, and we'll talk about that in 24 closed session. 25



Page 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Exactly. 1 2 Moving on to our committee reports. 3 We just had an engineering committee. I moved it a couple of days because I was away and I wanted to 4 5 get some time to get reestablished, so we did that 6 vesterday. 7 We basically, just to give a report, since I guess I'm still in charge of that committee, 8 9 we -- we got an update of the projects. Of course between the weather and the issue with the -- the 10 water boiling alert that we've done, there was other 11 12 things that kind of -- we didn't get everything maybe as quickly as we wanted to resolved or not 13 14 resolved, at least worked on. 15 However, once again under the 16 leadership of our team, and in collaboration with 17 our engineers at Remington & Vernick and so forth, 18 you should have gotten an operations report, which is very, very useful. I say this every meeting 19 because it really does help us understand where we 20 21 are, why we're doing something, and you're going to 22 see in today's agenda we have a number of items 23 basically based on the engineering committee and report that we need to get through to continue the 24 work in our city. So please, again, I advise our 25



Page 15 board members to at least review that report. It's, 1 2 you know, not easy to put together, but it gives you numbers, it gives you people, it gives you projects, 3 it gives you locations, and -- as best as we can. 4 5 So I want to thank again the team, the engineering committee -- Mr. Eccles serves on 6 that -- and Remington & Vernick for all of their 7 help as we move into the new year. So we'll --8 9 we'll be discussing some of those coming up. 10 Personnel, Mr. Dedar, besides the executive search, do you have anything you'd like to 11 12 add? MR. DEDAR: No. We already covered 13 because we don't have anything for personnel 14 15 except --16 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 17 MR. DEDAR: -- this executive 18 director search coming. You already explained good. Thanks, Mr. Chairman. 19 20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you very much. 21 Okay. So now we're going to move 22 into -- excuse me -- the executive director. Do you 23 want to talk about anything specific before we move into the engineering? 24 Michael, do you have --25



Page 16 MR. ARMSTRONG: No. I don't have 1 anything. 2 3 CHAIRMAN HILL: I know you'll have something in -- right. The -- this report --4 5 MR. ARMSTRONG: We'll leave it for closed session. 6 7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. Should we --8 let's see. 9 Cliff, do you want to do some of the highlights that we discussed, or how do you feel 10 about that as deputy? 11 12 MR. KEEN: Anything you'd like me to do, sir. 13 CHAIRMAN HILL: Well, the resolutions 14 15 that are coming up really are the important stuff, so I think once we get to those resolutions, it may 16 17 be some clarification for one or two of the items in 18 particular if you're not on the engineering committee we'll get to. Okay? 19 20 MR. KEEN: Okay. 21 CHAIRMAN HILL: All right. And we'll 22 move on then to -- let's see -- accounting and 23 finance from Anita. Beginning of a new year. And I know we have --24 25 MR. ARMSTRONG: You missed --



Page 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: I'm sorry? 1 MR. ARMSTRONG: You missed deputy 2 3 executive director of administration. CHAIRMAN HILL: Oh, I did. I'm so 4 5 sorry. How can I miss her? She's been busy. Ι think I woke her up in the morning one day via 6 When I finally got cell service, I'm like, 7 phone. oh, my gosh. Poor India. 8 9 India, go ahead. 10 MS. STILL: No worries. I just wanted to report that we've had three firms reply to 11 12 the RFQ for the rate study, and we haven't had a chance to look at those -- those responses yet, but 13 14 we did get three, so that's good. 15 The salary study is moving along. Gallagher has been a really good vendor keeping us 16 17 on task, so that has a six-month timeline for 18 completion. We wanted to have that complete before the rate study is done so that the considerations 19 20 could be taken into -- into the rate study 21 recommendations. 22 And the last thing is that the 23 employee retreat is on hold right now. We had a little obstacle or snafu with getting a location, so 24 we're back to square one with that. 25



Page 18 And that's pretty much all I have 1 today. Thank you. 2 3 CHAIRMAN HILL: That's fine. I mean, the board retreat is important, and we will get that 4 5 done, I know that, once we get over that. 6 I did have a question. I'm not sure 7 if India can answer it. When I was reading over the executive meeting, the QPA issue we had in December 8 9 with the City, how did that move long? Did we -are we okay with that now, or --10 MR. ARMSTRONG: No. 11 12 CHAIRMAN HILL: -- are we still struggling? 13 14 MR. ARMSTRONG: We should bring that 15 up in closed session because it's part of the shared services. 16 17 CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. 18 MR. ARMSTRONG: Yeah. But no. It's 19 unresolved. CHAIRMAN HILL: That's what I was 20 21 unfortunately feeling. Okay. So we'll talk about that in executive. 22 23 Okay. Very good. Thank you, India. Now, we'll move on to Anita. 24 25 Anita?



Page 19 MS. THAPA: Sure. Financial reports 1 are for the month of November. As of November, we 2 3 collected 92 point -- 92.33 percent of our user fee revenue, which totals 16.9 million. 4 5 As of December, we collected 18.2 million from our user fees, as well. That includes 6 7 80,000 in connection fee. 8 As of November also, we -- we spent 9 9.3 million in operating expenses and about 2.3 million in capital expenditures. 10 As for the cash management report, 11 there's nothing new to -- to be reported. 12 We are earning an average of 5.3 percent on our investment, 13 14 which is mostly in the money market accounts. And 15 as usual, balance adjustments and shutoffs are just for the board's information. Obviously, we're not 16 doing any shutoffs in wintertime. Probably it's 17 18 going to start either first week of March or -or -- or the first week of -- of April. 19 20 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. It depends on 21 the weather. 22 MS. THAPA: Yep. That's pretty much 23 about it. As usual, if you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to me. 24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 25 Thank you,



Page 20 Anita. 1 2 MS. THAPA: No problem. CHAIRMAN HILL: Okay. We're going to 3 move on to 11, which is our new business, and again, 4 5 the beginning of the agenda, there's a lot of things for -- that deals with engineering. 6 7 So maybe, Cliff, if you want to 8 highlight something as we move forward. The first 9 one's pretty easy. It's to solicit a bid for lime. This is resolution 11 a. It's one of the chemicals 10 we need to do our job. 11 12 So let's read that resolution, please. 13 14 MS. JOHNSON: Furnish and deliver 15 hydrated lime. Whereas, the Atlantic City MUA owns 16 17 and operates its own water department; 18 Whereas, the water treatment plant uses hydrated lime to treat and produce water. 19 20 Now therefore be it resolved, by the 21 board of directors of the MUA, that the 22 advertisement, proposal form, and specs, and 23 instructions to bidders for the -- to furnish and deliver hydrated lime is hereby approved and 24 25 adopted.



Page 21 The said bid is to be received and 1 publicly opened and read at a bid opening of the MUA 2 3 to be announced at a later date. CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. So this is 4 5 just to go out to bid. Could I have a motion? 6 7 MR. DEDAR: Motion. 8 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. 9 And a second? MS. DAVIES: Second. 10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. 11 Roll call. 12 13 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Hill? 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes. 15 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Dedar? MR. DEDAR: Yes. 16 17 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Langford? 18 MS. LANGFORD: Yes. 19 MS. JOHNSON: Mr. Eccles? MR. ECCLES: Yes. 20 MS. JOHNSON: Ms. Davies? 21 MS. DAVIES: Yes. 22 23 CHAIRMAN HILL: Thank you. The next resolution is really 24 25 important. We discussed this quite a bit in the



Page 22 engineering committee yesterday. One of our big 1 projects is the Baltic Avenue main replacement, very 2 3 expensive. We're trying to work in cooperation with the City, and we're going to now award an 4 5 engineering contract. So let's read the resolution, please. 6 7 MS. JOHNSON: Engineering services for Baltic Avenue water main replacement. 8 9 Whereas, there is a need to retain engineering consulting services to evaluate and 10 coordinate the work on the MUA's Baltic Avenue water 11 12 main replacement; Whereas, Remington & Vernick 13 14 Engineers, previously appointed as consulting 15 engineers for the MUA, have provided an estimate attached herewith to provide engineering consulting 16 17 services to evaluate and coordinate the work of the 18 MUA in a sum not to exceed the amount of \$365,000. 19 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. And this is a 20 major project we've been working. It's been on our 21 plate for a while, so we really want to move forward 22 on this. 23 Cliff, would you like to make a comment before we move? 24 MR. KEEN: I think you said most of 25



Page 23 it. The City has a DOT grant. 1 2 CHAIRMAN HILL: Right. 3 MR. KEEN: And we want to make sure that we are not in the way of the City meeting their 4 5 timelines, so it's really important that we start moving on this one. 6 7 CHAIRMAN HILL: Exactly. And of course we've gotten some really great cooperation 8 9 with the City of Atlantic City and we want that to continue. 10 So anybody have a question on this? 11 12 Hearing none --MR. WARD: I don't have a question, 13 14 but just an item. 15 CHAIRMAN HILL: Go ahead. 16 MR. WARD: Growing up on Baltic 17 Avenue in Atlantic City, Remington & Vernick 18 might -- might recognize that there are railroad tracks underneath Baltic Avenue all the way up. 19 There are plenty of railroad tracks under there, so 20 this is going to be quite a job. 21 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: You're on mute, Bob. 23 MR. SMITH: Not only that, but the drainage canal runs the full length of Baltic Avenue 24 also. 25



Page 24 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. 1 2 MR. WARD: Oh, yeah. 3 MR. KEEN: Yeah. MR. WARD: A lot of stuff 4 5 underground. CHAIRMAN HILL: Yeah. So we're all 6 7 aware of that. 8 MR. ECCLES: And Bruce and -- Bruce, 9 Gary, I know you guys know my grandfather helped lay down some of those tracks. 10 CHAIRMAN HILL: Absolutely. 11 MR. WARD: They're still there. 12 13 MR. ECCLES: I hear you. 14 CHAIRMAN HILL: Yes, he did. 15 MR. ECCLES: That's what happens when you're born and raised here. You know everything. 16 17 MR. WARD: That's right. CHAIRMAN HILL: You know where 18 19 everything is hidden in more ways than one. Very good. 20 21 MR. WARD: You do. 22 CHAIRMAN HILL: All right. Very 23 good. We'll move on this thing. Can I have a motion? 24 25 MR. ECCLES: I'll make a motion.
